They are closed to the public in January and February .

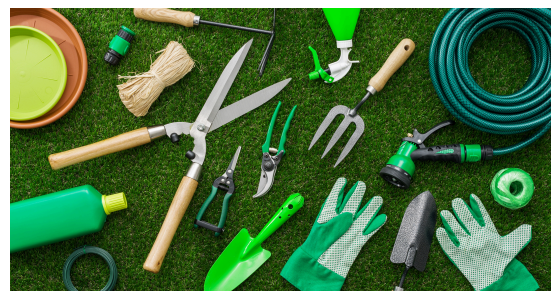
From Fire Chief Densmore

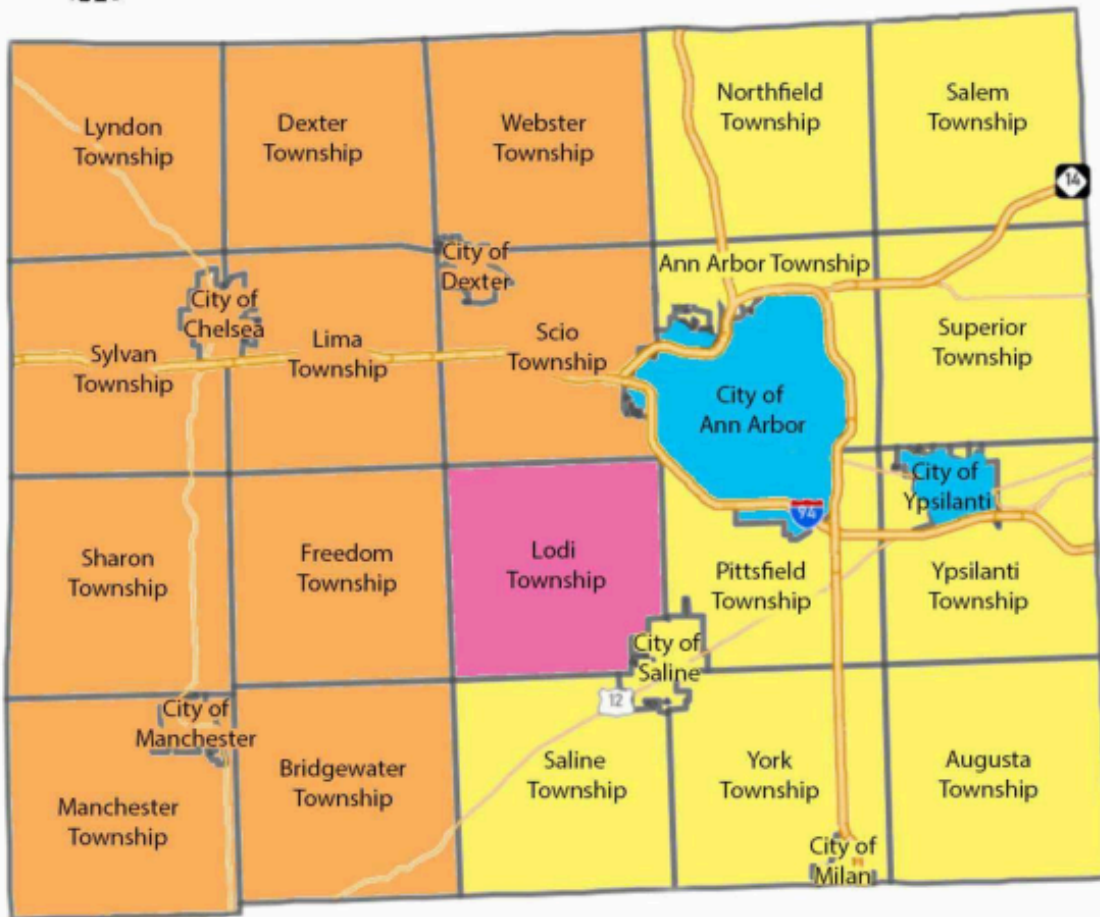
