LETTER FROM THE SUPERVISOR

Winter 2024

Looking ahead to 2024, it is important to reflect upon the positives from this year:

- The former Police substation, 1405 Holmes Road, has been repurposed to be the new Community Network Center. The hope for this space is to connect residents to needed services such as county programs, financial and credit counseling, individualized case management and tax services for seniors, assisting residents with paperwork to sign up for opportunities and government benefits, group meetings, etc. These service providers and nonprofits will meet with Township residents in the community where they live, to ease access to services and allow our residents to THRIVE. We are excited to PILOT this new center and to have hired a social worker, our Community Resource Coordinator, to implement the vision and connect residents.
- · We have also hired a new Neighborhood Coordinator, who has scheduled two community-wide daytime meetings as an alternative to evening meetings to accommodate more schedules. Go to our new website www.ypsitownship. org or email nhw@ypsitownship.org for more information.
- The original Gault Village shopping center was demolished in the fall of 2023. The Township Board, through legal counsel, has placed a lien on the property to hopefully get reimbursed for the costs incurred for the removal of the blighted, unsafe structure. The current or future owners will work with the township and residents' input on redevelopment so that we can see this neighborhood commercial space prosper once again. Our legal department and Office of Community Standards have been successful in resolving many public nuisances for community stabilization. Our goal is compliance first, always.
- Substantial investments to community infrastructure included roads, drains, non-motorized path enhancements, new street lighting and conversion to LED lighting, tree plantings, and maintenance improvements to Township facilities. The Water Resource Commission, Road Commission, and Ypsilanti Community Utilities leaders have been meeting to find alternative and additional plans for storm water management to try and address the effects of the dreadful rainfalls that have harmed many in our community.
- Willow Run Acres, an urban farm in Appleridge Park, had its first harvest. Community Meetings for residents in West Willow and Burns neighborhood park were held to gather ideas and input from residents for new investments in 2024. Two pickle ball/tennis court refurbish grants were received for Community Center and Clubview Park in 2024. The Loonfeather Park renovation, funded by a grant, was completed this year.
- In 2015, the Township became the first "Bee City" in the state of Michigan. The Township is committed to protecting bees and their environment through preserving open spaces and improving our existing parks.
- · The township worked with our lobbyist to request relief for the tax debt that resulted from the school merge of Willow Run and Ypsilanti Schools in 2013. The state of Michigan allocated 42 million dollars for debt relief in November 2023. This is a huge blessing, and we are thankful to our state elected representatives for supporting this much needed and deserved financial assistance.
- The City of Ypsilanti and Ypsilanti Township are working together on an Ecorse Road Business district and investments in street scape, lighting, and non-motorized path.
- · We continue to provide COVID at-home test kits and KN95 adult and children's masks at the Civic Center and Community Center. Please call 734-544-4000 ext. 6 with any questions.

Please put this magnet on your refrigerator for a quick reference.

Find your trash day on the Recycle Magnet Schedule. Recycle collection is bi-weekly. The dates listed below your trash day are your 2024 Recycle Collection Dates. Please note that recycle dates listed in red are a one-day delay due to a Waste Management holiday.

The 2024 Waste Management Holiday Schedule is at the bottom of the magnet. Keep in mind that your trash and yard waste collection is weekly. If your trash, yard waste and recycle collection day falls on the day of a holiday or on the days following a holiday, you will experience a one-day delay in all services that week. If your recycle day does not fall in a holiday week, your recycle collection will not be delayed.

Please note that Waste Management and Ypsilanti Township holidays may not all be the same.

MAINTENANCE AND DELIVERY

Waste Management (WM) assigns, delivers and maintains one 96-gallon trash cart for weekly trash collection to each single-family home in Ypsilanti Township at no extra charge. Please contact WM if you need a cart delivered to your home, or need repair or replacement of your cart, lid or wheels.

TRASH PREPARATION AND PICK-UP

- Please place your 96-gallon trash cart at the curb after
 6:00pm the night before your trash day to ensure timely collection. It must be at the roadside no later than 5:00am on the day of collection if you must set it out in the morning.
- Situate the WM trash cart within 4-ft. (unobstructed) of the roadway, with wheels and handle facing your home.
- Trash items must be bagged and contained inside the WM 96-gallon trash cart. Please do not pack, overflow or stack items on top of the lid. The lid should be closed.
- No trash will be collected from cardboard boxes, drums, fabricated contatiners, storebought containers or yard waste bags.
- Remaining items must be removed from the roadway by 6:00AM the following day.
- Please contact WM 48-hours prior to your collection day to schedule addition trash bag pick-up. The cost is \$3.12 per bag. Advance credit card payment will be processed over the phone. Please ask for your confirmation number. The Township does not sell trash tags or bulk item tags.
- If you move, please leave your WM trash cart for the next resident.

CONTACT WM TO RENT AN ADDITIONAL WM TRASH CART

Advance credit card payment of \$86.40/cart/year, billed annually will be processed over the phone.

BULK ITEM SCHEDULING AND PREPATION FOR PICK-UP

- One Bulk Item May Be Scheduled Weekly For Removal On Your Garbage Collection Day.
- Please schedule collection of your bulk item at least 48-hours in advance of your trash day by calling WM at 866-797-9018 or by email at customerserviceRS_GLA@ wm.com to ensure collection of your bulk item on your next trash pick-up day.
- You will need to provide a description of the bulk item, the date you are requesting for pick-up, the address of the pick-up location, your name and your phone number. Please ask for your confirmation number.
- Mattresses and upholstered items (couch, chair, recliner, ottoman, etc.) must be wrapped separately in plastic and held with duct tape to ensure safety of workers due to bed bugs. Wrap Leather/Vinyl materials only if the items have human/animal feces or blood on them.

UNACCEPTABLE TRASH ITEMS: Antifreeze/Gasoline/Motor Oil, Automobile Batteries, Boats, Riding Lawn Mowers, Snow Mobiles, Tires/Vehicle Parts, Hazardous Waste Materials, Insecticides (See Washtenaw County Toxic Center For Disposal), Liquids, Oil-Based Paints, Propane Tanks, Burning-Barrels/Hot Ashes, Brick/Cement Blocks, Building/Lumber Debris, Roofing Shingles, Dirt/Sod, Gravel/Rock/Stones, Tree Stumps, Railroad Ties, Computer Monitors, Hot Tubs, Pianos.

ACCEPTABLE BULK ITEMS FOR TRASH REMOVAL

- **BATTERIES:** Household (alkaline) batteries.
- **CARDBOARD:** Must flatten to 4-ft. x 4-ft. bundles (use duct tape or twine to hold); must not exceed 40-pounds.
- **CARPET/PAD:** Properly prepared carpet bundles must be tied at both ends with duct tape or string, must weigh less than 40-pounds; must not exceed 4-feet in length or 8-inches in diameter. Six (6) bundles equal one scheduled bulk item.
- **FREON ITEMS:** Refrigerator or freezer (doors must be removed and left next to the appliance), water cooler, air-conditioner, de-humidifier. All Freon Units must have Freon removed by a technician and tagged for collection before scheduling bulk pick-up with WM.
- **FURNITURE:** Table with matching chairs (4-6), couch, love-seat, dresser, armoire/curio, buffet cabinet (broken down), mattress and box spring (considered one bulk item, but wrap separately), headboard, footboard, frame (considered one bulk item).
- OTHER TRASH TYPE ITEMS: Bicycles, grills (propane tank must be removed), lawn mowers, weed trimmers and edgers (all items must be drained of gas and oil), storm doors and windows (must break glass out of frames and placed in a hard container or small box labeled "BROKEN GLASS" and taped shut), swing sets (must cut poles down to 6-feet in length), toilets, TVs, vacuum cleaners.
- PAINT CANS: Completely Dry Latex Paint Only. Do not place paint cans in the trash cart. To dry paint, fill cans to the rim with kitty litter, sawdust or sand; stir until hardened. Place dried paint cans, lids removed, on the ground next to the trash cart. One to ten paint cans equal one scheduled bulk item.
- **WHITE GOODS:** Dishwasher, stove, washer/dryer, water tank, etc. No Commercial Size Appliances Will Be Collected.
- **WOOD PIECES:** Remove or pound nails flat. Bundles must be tied at both ends with duct tape or string, must weigh less than 50-pounds, and must not exceed 4-feet in length. Two bundles equal one scheduled bulk item.

RECYCLE PREPARATION AND PICK-UP

- Please place your 96-gallon recycle cart at the curb after 6:00pm the night before your trash day to ensure timely collection. It must be at the roadside no later than 5:00am on the day of collection if you must set it out in the morning.
- Situate your recycling cart within 4-ft. (unobstructed) of the roadway, as well as 4-ft. away from other items placed at the road for collection. Have wheels and handle facing your home.
- Recycle items must be contained inside the 96-gallon recycling cart, however, please DO NOT BAG your recycle items. The recycling machines cannot handle the consistency of plastic bags. The machines breakdown, causing delays, repair costs and a raise in service costs to the community.
- Please do not pack, overflow or stack items on top of the lid. The lid should be closed.
- Remaining items must be removed from the roadway by 6:00AM the following day.

WM will not collect recycling from: Cardboard boxes, drums, fabricated containers, store-bought containers, stacked containers, or red, green and blue bins.

RENT AN ADDITIONAL RECYCLING CART

- Contact Waste Management (WM) if you would like to rent a WM 96-gallon recycle cart. The fee to rent an additional recycling cart from WM is \$54/cart/year, billed annually. Advance credit card payment will be processed over the
- WM will deliver your rented WM 96-gallon recycle cart to your home and will maintain the rented cart if damaged due to normal wear and tear. Contact WM if your rented WM recycle cart, lid or wheels are damaged and need to be repaired or replaced.
- If you move, please contact WM to cancel your recycle cart rental. WM will retrieve the cart.

RECYCLE GUIDELINES

ALWAYS RECYCLE: 1, 2, 4, 5 & 7



- Plastic: Only emptied, and rinsed household bottles, jugs and containers are recyclable. Look for the #1, 2, 4, 5 or 7 inside the "recyclable triangle" on the bottom or side of the container. Lids and caps may be
- Glass: Only emptied, and rinsed household bottles, jugs and jars. Labels may be left on.
- Aluminum & Tin: Non-deposit and deposit cans. Lids and labels may be left on.
- Paper: Break down and flatten corrugated cardboard. Junk mail, catalogs, glossy inserts, magazines, newspapers, paperback books, telephone books, canned beverage cases, cardboard egg cartons, brown paper bags, towel roll paperboard (cereal, tissue, shoe boxes).



- Plastics: No Unmarked Plastics/Plastics without numbers! No Plastic Bags or Liners of Any Kind Including Bags Labeled With a Recycling Logo. No Plastic Food Wrappers/Straws.
- **Hazardous-type bottles:** No antifreeze or motor oil.
- **Glass/Ceramics:** No broken glass beverage glasses, dishes, ceramic dishware, Pyrex dishes, light bulbs, mirrors or windows.
- **Aluminum & Tin:** No cookware, metal pots/pans, disposable pie tins or baking travs. No scrap metal or wire hangers.
- Paper: No pizza boxes, shredded/tissue-paper products, paper towel/ napkins, paper cups/plates or wax paper.
- **Additional Unacceptable Items:** No batteries of any kind/size. No concrete, drywall, wood/wood items, electrical cords/cables, paint cans, household cleaners/chemicals, propane tanks, flammable liquids, garden hoses, tires, tools, yard waste, bio-hazardous/medical waste (syringes/ needles), other hazardous waste, food/liquids, greasy food containers, to-golids, Styrofoam materials, garbage, clothing/shoes, diapers, children's toys, holiday decorations, hardcover books, VCR/VHS tapes or plastic CD cases.

YARD WASTE PREPARATION

- Yard Waste (YW) Collection is unlimited and only occurs in designated paper compost bags (available at local stores) or a 32-gallon container labeled with Ypsilanti Township **YARD WASTE** stickers on two sides of the containers.
- Free **YARD WASTE** stickers are available in the Tilden R. Stumbo Civic Center lobby, at the Ypsilanti Township Community Center on E. Clark Road, or by mail (contact RSD at 734-544-4000 option 4).
- Brush/Branches (no more than 2"-diameter each) will be collected by The Waste Management (WM) YW Truck if bundled to no more than 18" in Diameter, no more than 3 4ft. in length, and tied with twine or string. Bundles must not be heavier than 40-pounds. Bundles over 40-pounds or larger than 18" in diameter will NOT be accepted. (No construction/lumber debris)

YARD WASTE COLLECTION

- Yard Waste bags, bundles, and containers must be placed (unobstructed) within 4-ft. of the roadway and 4-ft. from other curbside items after 6:00pm the night before your trash day to ensure timely collection. If you must set it out in the morning, it must be at the roadside no later than 5:00am on your day of collection.
- Remaining items must be removed by 6:00AM the day after collection.
- Yard Waste will NOT be collected from any plastic bags, containers over 32-gallon in size, containers or compost bags over the weight limit of 40 pounds, recycle bins, fabricated tubs, stacked containers and/or stacked compost bags.
- Sticks and branches must be contained inside the bag or container and must not be sticking out of the bag or container by 12 inches.
- **No Wet Bags or Containers.** If overnight rain is expected, please store YW in a dry location and place at the curb by 5:00AM on your collection day. Wet yard waste over 40-pounds will not be collected.
- During colder months, it is recommended to use compost bags. Leaves that are frozen in containers cannot be removed.
- As a safety precaution during collection, containers must not have attached lids.

SCHEDULE CHRISTMAS TREE REMOVAL

- Christmas trees will be collected by the Waste Management (WM) Bulk Truck December-March. This will not be counted as your one-weekly bulk item, but you do need to schedule removal. Contact WM by phone at 866-797-9018 or by email customerserviceRS_GLA@wm.com 48-hours in advance of your trash day to schedule removal of your Christmas tree.
- Please ask for your confirmation number.
- Christmas trees 6-feet and taller must be cut in half and placed at the curb after 6:00PM the night before your trash day.

ACCEPTABLE YW: Grass clippings, vines, leaves, weeds, garden debris, shrubs and brush trimmings that are less than 2" in diameter.

UNACCEPTABLE YW: Dirt, sod, animal droppings, trash, food items (apples, pumpkins, garden foods, etc.), straw, hay, corn stalks, branches over 2" in diameter, wood chips, stumps, wood, logs, rocks, mulch, root balls and landscaping timbers.

Residents of Ypsilanti Township single-family homes may dispose of branches that are less than one (1) foot in diameter, and Christmas trees free of charge at the Ypsilanti Township Compost Site, 2600 E. Clark Rd, Ypsilanti, MI 48198. A driver's license is required to be shown as proof of Ypsilanti Township residency. MICHIGAN VOTING CHANGES

In November 2022, Michigan voters passed a proposal that amended sections of the Michigan voting laws. The major changes included the following:

- Recognize fundamental right to vote without harassing conduct
- Require military or overseas ballots be counted if postmarked by election day
- Provide voter right to verify identity with photo ID or signed statement
- Provide voter right to single application to vote absentee in all elections
- Require state-funded absentee-ballot drop boxes, and postage for absentee applications and ballots
- Provide that only election officials may conduct post-election audits
- Require nine days of early in-person voting
- Allow donations to fund elections, which must be disclosed
- Require canvass boards certify election results based only on the official records of votes cast.

The biggest changes include the additional absentee ballot drop boxes, nine days of early in-person voting, and changes in the absentee application process.

Drop box locations will remain on Ypsilanti Township property with camera surveillance compliant with Michigan voting law for ensured security. These drop boxes will be checked regularly by Clerks' Office staff and approved election workers ONLY.

THREE WAYS TO VOTE IN MICHIGAN

1. Absentee Voting:

Absentee voting is voting absent from the polls. These ballots are turned into the Clerk's Office in person or by mail. These ballots are stored in an envelope signed by the voter and are kept securely in the Clerk's Office until election day when the votes are counted.

Permanent Absent Voter List

Voters may now check a new box on the Absent Voter Ballot Application to indicate that the voter wishes to join the Permanent Absent Voter List. The voter will automatically receive an Absentee Voter Ballot Application before every election that they are eligible to participate. The voter can choose whether, or not, they would like to submit the application to receive a ballot.

Please note that ballots **CANNOT** be forwarded by the postal service. If you will be at a different address at the time of the election, please call the Clerk's Office to update your mailing address.

2. Early Voting/ Early In-Person Voting:

This is different than absentee voting. It is a nine-day period of in-person early voting that always begins the second Saturday before State and Federal elections and ends the Sunday before an election. The voter will place their filled-in ballot through a tabulator, after which it CANNOT be spoiled and will remain there until the end of the day. At that time, election workers of both parties will place the ballots into a Secure Ballot Box (a secure location to place absentee ballots or applications to vote). They will seal the box. The tabulator will be "suspended" for the evening and will resume function in the morning once it has been properly inspected and the polls have been re-opened. The tabulators are programmed securely to ensure that no vote tallies can be done prior to 8pm on election day to ensure the security, the integrity and the validity of the votes. Be on the lookout for a mailer regarding the location of early voting sites.

3. Vote on Election Day At Your Polling Location:

Voting at your assigned polling location on election day will remain the same. There will be no changes to your election day polling locations at this time.

Property Taxes

- Summer Bill malled July 1 and due September 14.
 On September 15, 1% interest is added to any unpaid balance.
 An additional 1% Interest is added on the first of each month thereafter until paid in full.
- Winter Bill mailed December 1 and due February 14.

 On February 15, any unpaid balance will have a 3% penalty added. Payment must be received by the due date to avoid interest/penalty. Postmarks are NOT honored. All checks returned for non-payment incur a \$30 fee.

Please note: If the tax due date falls on a weekend, payments are accepted through the next business day without Interest or penalty.**

On March 1, all unpaid real property taxes are transferred to the Washtenaw County Treasurer as delinquent. Contact the County Treasurer at (734) 222-6600 for balance due.

Payment Options

- **By Mail:** Send the top portion of your bill, along with a check payable to: Ypsilanti Township, 7200 S. Huron River Drive, Ypsilanti, MI 48197
- In Person: The Treasurer's Office is open Monday-Friday 8:30am-4:30pm (closed 12:00pm-1:00pm). We accept cash, check and credit/debit cards (2.8% vendor fee added to credit/debit card payments).
- **Local Banks:** Make payments in full at any Ypsilanti Branch of Bank of Ann Arbor or TRUE Community Credit Union either the Whittaker Road Branch, or the Mansfield Street Branch. The top portion of your bill must accompany your payment and cannot be late.
- Online: Pay at ypsitownshlp.org. When paying by e-check (providing bank account and routing numbers). There is a \$1.50 flat fee (\$10 flat fee for balances over \$10,000). Credit/debit cards have a vendor added 2.8% processing fee.
- Drive-Up Gray Box: Located in the Ypsilanti Township parking lot. NO CASH – Checks Only.

Eligible senior citizens and service persons with a household income of \$40,000 or less may apply for a deferment to extend the deadline to pay property taxes without penalty or interest on a principal residence. Contact the Treasurer's office for details.

The Ypsilanti Township's Assessment Department is responsible for the annual valuation of all taxable real and personal property within the Township as of "Tax Day" (Dec. 31). All questions regarding assessments and property characteristics can be directed to the Assessment Department.

The Department conducts an annual canvass for residential and commercial/ industrial properties, with the purpose of updating record card data for accuracy to estimate uniform, fair and equitable property valuations. The field staff will visit each property to verify measurements and all attributes essential to the valuation process. All Assessment Department employees are properly identifiable while in the field.

Homeowners:

- Property Transfer Affidavit (due within 45 days of a transfer of ownership)
- Principal Residence Exemption

The Principal Residence Exemption (P.R.E.) is an exemption of the 18 mills school operating for the one home you own and occupy as your primary residence. The deadline to file is June 1. for the summer tax levies.

For the convenience of all Ypsilanti Township residents, the Assessment Department invites you to submit the above forms by email to assessment.forms@ypsitownship.org. The Assessment Department also accepts form submissions in the gray drop-box located at the front entrance of the Tilden R. Stumbo Civic Center, but would like to remind all taxpayers that if they wish to receive a stamped copy in return, they must attach a copy with the original and provide a self-addressed envelope.

Business Owners:

- Small Business Property Tax Exemption Claim (L-5076)
- Eligible Manufacturing Personal Property Tax Exemption Claim (L-5278)

If the combined true cash value of all business personal property is less than \$80,000, your business qualifies to file a form L-5076 resulting in an exemption from personal property taxation. If you qualify as a manufacturing business, a form L-5278 can be filed with the Department. These forms are due by Feb. 20 for the year of exemption. EMERGENCY: DIAL ... 9-1-1

The Ypsilanti Township Fire Department is an emergency response agency, consisting of 25 career firefighters, operating out of three (3) stations, covering nearly 32 square miles. We participate in Automatic Mutual Aid with Pittsfield, Superior, Van Buren Townships and Ypsilanti City. We provide emergent response to fire, medical, hazardous materials, ice & swift water rescue, technical rescue and vehicle extrication calls, as well as non-emergent response to open burning complaints, non-life threatening medical, odor investigations, wires down, etc.

The Fire Department also provides prevention services that include fire safety inspections, plan reviews, site surveys, addressing, code adoption & enforcement, fire cause & origin investigations, public education demonstrations to schools & businesses, a smoke detector distribution program and participates in NHW meetings.

Fire Code: International Fire Code 2018

Fire Prevention Ordinance 2018 Requirements:

- Smoke detector for rental units & new homes
- Fire extinguisher & Carbon Monoxide detectors for rental units.

The Fire Department will provide two (2) 10yr lithium powered smoke detectors for residents in need.

Open Burning:

A permit is required for any burning in the Township and issued under strict guidelines. The Fire Marshal can provide the details in order to obtain a permit & can be contacted during business hours at 734.544.4107. Please remember, the Township provides a very successful seasonal yard waste collection program.

Recreational Fire Ordinance:

You may have a recreational fire on your property without a permit if you follow the rules listed below:

■ The fire must be used to cook food for human consumption; you must use seasoned fire wood only; the fire must not create a nuisance of any kind; the fire must be constantly attended; there must be a means of extinguishment close by; all fires must be at least 50' away from any structure; no fire can be larger than 5'x5'x5'.

Exceptions to Recreational Fires:

Single-family residents are allowed to have a recreational fire as close as 15' away from their homes in an approved container: "Weber" type outdoor fireplace or a properly constructed fire pit made of metal, stone, brick or concrete.



HYDRO DAM RECREATION OPPORTUNITIES

The Ford Lake Hydroelectric Station (Hydro Dam), operating under the FERC Project #5334 is required to provide recreation opportunities to the community without discrimination.

The Hydro Dam's Recreation Plan is part of the Charter Township of Ypsilanti Parks Master Plan. Some of the amenities provided are: lake access for boating and fishing, playground equipment, fishing, picnic tables and shelters.

The dam and powerhouse was part of Henry Ford Village Industries in the 1930's, built to provide electrical power to the Ford Motor Company's Ypsilanti Plant. Today, the electrical power is sold to DTE under a PURPA Power Purchase Agreement and generates enough renewable electricity equivalent for 750 homes on yearly average. The Hydro Dam also allows the Township to lower it's carbon footprint by using the renewable attribute associated with hydropower.



- At a Community Police Station If you would like to make a report at a community station, use the call button/call box located on the building for Washtenaw Metro Dispatch and a deputy/officer will respond.

Suspect Description – Sex, Race, Age, Height, Weight, Hair Color & Style, Eye Color, Shirt, Pants, Shoes, Hat and any scars or other marks that would help you remember the person.

Vehicle Description – Year, Make, Model, Body Style, Color, License Plate Number, Dents or Scratches.

Boom Box/Noise Complaints - 734,994,2911: The Noise Ordinance prohibits noise from loud car stereos that is plainly audible from inside a house or building or plainly audible outdoors 50' or more from the source.

- Suspend subscriptions or ask a friend or neighbor to pick up newspapers, mail and flyers so that they do not pile up outside the home.

If you have any concerns with the roadways such as potholes, dead trees near the road, road signs that are knocked down or missing, traffic signals that are out or the timing needs to be adjusted, you can report your issue online at scroads.org/report, by phone at 734.761.1500, or by downloading the **WCRC Fix It App** (available for Apple and Android devices).

You can also contact WCRC, if you are interested in traffic calming devices (ex: speed humps) for your neighborhood street.





"Sharps" are needles, syringes with attached needles and disposable lancets. Sharps are dangerous in your household trash. The safest way to dispose of sharps is to take them to a Sharps collection center.

Sharps Disposal Guidelines:

- **Step 1:** Place in a puncture-resistant sharps container.
- **Step 2:** When full, close the container and then tape it shut.
