#### LETTER FROM THE SUPERVISOR

Winter 2026

As we get ready for 2026, it is important to reflect upon the busy year that we have had:

- 2025 was a major construction year for Ypsilanti Township buildings and parks! The 14B Court has reopened after a \$5 million renovation, funded by a grant from the State of Michigan. The Civic Center parking lot and pond projects, funded by American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds, have also been completed. We have made many improvements to our robust park system around the Township, also paid for by ARPA funds. West Willow Park received an additional grant from the Republic Services Charitable Foundation, in partnership with Habitat for Humanity, the New West Willow Neighborhood Association, and Odindi Youth Action Village, to make upgrades that promote intergenerational enjoyment of this neighborhood park.
- The Township had the pleasure of hosting several excellent special events this year. Our first-ever Rowfest took place on the newly installed Ford Lake Rowing Course. The event was a smashing success, bringing in rowers from across the country who appreciated the beauty of Ford Lake Park. Typically, this event rotates locations each year, but the organizers were so impressed that they have asked to return in July of 2026. We thank everyone who volunteered and made this event possible.
- The Township continues to make substantial investments in community infrastructure, including roads, non-motorized path enhancements, and drainage studies and improvements. In September, the Water Resources Commission was awarded a grant for green stormwater infrastructure, which will be used to install rain gardens at Clubview Park, Fairway Hills, and the Rosedale Right of Way to help reduce water runoff.
- In 2015, the Township became the first "Bee City" in the State of Michigan. The Township remains committed to protecting pollinators and their environment by preserving open spaces and improving our existing parks. We are collaborating with Life After Incarceration: Transition and Reentry (LAITR) to install a pollinator garden on the Township lawn. LAITR was awarded a grant from the Washtenaw County Conservation District to build this habitat.
- In the Township Civic Center lobby, there is a free Naloxone vending machine that the Township received through a grant. There are also two medication drop boxes at Township facilities, one at the Community Center and one at the Civic Center. These drop boxes were funded by the Opioid Settlement funds the Township has received.

# **Ypsilanti Township**

Trash, Recycling, Bulk and Seasonal Yard Waste Collection Guide



#### Dear Ypsilanti Township Resident,

WM is proud to be your environmental solutions provider. Our curbside collection program features automated collection for trash and recycling, along with seasonal yard waste and bulk items.

We thank you for the opportunity to serve you and help Ypsilanti Township stay clean and green.

#### **Automated Trash and Recycling Collection**

WM provides a 96-gallon green cart with green lid for trash, and the Township provides a 96-gallon green cart with yellow lid for recycling. All material must be placed inside the correct cart with the lid fully closed for collection.

Bags of trash or recyclables or other materials outside of your cart will not be collected.

#### Service Guidelines

To ensure the truck's automatic arms can lift the carts, please place your carts at least three feet apart and away from other objects like parked cars, mailboxes and trees. The cart should face the street with the wheels and handle of the cart facing your house.





**Recycling Cart** - Please break down boxes to maximize capacity. Material outside the cart will not be collected. See page 4 for tips to **Recycle Right®**.



**Trash Cart** - Trash must be bagged and tied before it is placed inside the trash cart. Material outside the cart will not be collected.



Place materials at the curb the night before your scheduled collection or by 6 a.m. the day of your pickup.

#### **Collection Schedule**

- Trash is collected weekly.
- · Recycling is collected every other week.
- Yard waste is collected weekly on your trash day.
   Collection begins the first full week of April and concludes the last full week of November each year.

#### **Yard Waste Collection**

During yard waste season, you may use Kraft paper bags or labeled 32-gallon cans for collection. Free yard waste stickers are available at the Tilden R. Stumbo Civic Center or Ypsilanti Township Community Center. Stickers may also be requested by mail by calling Residential Services at 734-554-4000 x4.

#### **Acceptable Yard Waste Items:**

- Grass clippings
- Leaves
- Garden debris
- Shrubs, bush trimmings, & branches

#### Non-Acceptable Yard Waste Items

- Branches exceeding dimensions below
- Dirt
- Food Items (apples, pumpkins, garden foods)
- Mulch
- Pet waste

- Rocks
- Sod
- Straw, hay, corn stalks
- Stumps, logs, wood, wood chips, root balls, landscaping timbers
- Trash

#### How to Prepare Brush and Branches for Collection

Bundles may be up to 18 inches in diameter and four feet in length, should weigh no more than 50 pounds and must be secured with string. Branches within the bundle cannot exceed two inches in diameter.

#### **Bulk Item Collection**

WM will collect one (1) bulk item each week on your regular service day at no additional cost.

Evictions, clean-outs and large set-outs are not permissible.

#### **Acceptable Bulk**

- Carpet & Padding: Must be rolled and securely bundled in four-foot sections of less than 50 pounds each. Six (6) bundles count as one bulk item.
- Household Furniture: Includes items such as tables, chairs, and couches. Upholstered items like mattresses, box springs and bed frames must be wrapped in plastic.
- Paint Cans & Containers: Must be dried and solidified for collection. Place paint cans on the ground next to your trash cart with lids removed. Seven (7) cans equal one bulk item.
- Toilets: Must be empty of liquids and the tank must be detached from the bowl.

#### White Goods & Appliances

- Includes dishwashers, stoves, washers and dryers, and water tanks.
- Refrigerators must have doors removed.
- · Commercial appliances are not accepted.

#### Special Handling for Items with Freon

Items containing Freon must be properly drained and tagged by a technician for collection. Items that are not drained will not be collected.

#### **Holiday Tree Recycling**

Residents can recycle real holiday trees at no additional cost from the last week of December through the end of March. If your tree is larger than six feet, please cut it in half before placing it curbside for collection. Only real trees are accepted. Please remove all decorations, including tinsel, lights, ornaments, and tree stands. Flocked trees, artificial trees, or decorated trees are not accepted for recycling.

#### Free Drop-Off at Ypsilanti Township Compost Site

Township residents may drop off recycling and yard waste, obtain compost or use refuse dumpsters at the Compost Site (2600 E Clark Rd). Proof of single-family home residency is required. Please visit ypsitownship.org for further information.

#### **Need an Extra Trash or Recycling Cart?**

Additional containers are available for a fee.





#### **Water/Sewer Rebate**

Ypsilanti Township Board of Trustees and the Ypsilanti Community Utilities Authority (YCUA) have come together to offer Ypsilanti Township Residents a rebate program for water bill assistance to help those who might qualify for financial hardship assistance.

Please email supervisor.info@ypsitownship.org or call 734-544-4000, ext. #6 with questions or to request an application. You can also find the application on our website under: Community – Utility Assistance & Information.

Once the application is received, reviewed for verification of qualifications, and approved, the rebate will be applied to your bi-monthly YCUA water bill for one full year.

#### **Property Taxes**

- **Summer Bill** mailed July 1 and due September 14. On September 15, 1% interest is added to any unpaid balance. An additional 1% Interest is added on the first of each month thereafter until paid in full.
- Winter Bill mailed December 1 and due February 14.

On February 15, any unpaid balance will have a 3% penalty added. Payment must be received by the due date to avoid interest/penalty. Postmarks are NOT honored. All checks returned for non-payment incur a \$30 fee.

### If the tax due date falls on a weekend, payments are accepted through the next business day without Interest or penalty.

On March 1, all unpaid real property taxes are transferred to the Washtenaw County Treasurer as delinquent. Contact the County Treasurer at (734) 222-6600 for balance due.

#### **Payment Options**

- **By Mail:** Send the top portion of your bill, along with a check payable to: Ypsilanti Township, 7200 S. Huron River Drive, Ypsilanti, MI 48197
- In Person: The Treasurer's Office is open Monday-Friday 8:30am-4:30pm (closed 12:00pm-1:00pm). We accept cash, check and credit/debit cards (vendor fee added to credit/debit card payments).
- **Local Banks:** Make payments in full at any Ypsilanti Branch of Bank of Ann Arbor or TRUE Community Credit Union. The top portion of your bill must accompany your payment and be paid by the due date.
- Online: Pay at ypsitownship.org. Vendor fee added to all online payments.
- Drive-Up Gray Box: Located in the Ypsilanti Township parking lot. NO CASH – Checks Only.

Eligible senior citizens and service persons with a household income of \$40,000 or less may apply for a deferment to extend the deadline to pay property taxes without penalty or interest on a principal residence. Contact the Treasurer's office for details.

#### **Dog Licenses**

All dogs in Ypsilanti Township are required to be licensed. The Treasurer's office can issue or renew dog licenses upon viewing proof of current rabies vaccine. Licenses are valid until the date the rabies vaccination expires.

#### **License Fees**

The Clerk's Office is responsible for a host of functions including the administration of all Township Elections, registering and maintaining Township residents' voter information, maintaining statutory records, coordination of Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests, processing Peddler Permit requests, and Liquor License Applications. The Clerk's Office also maintains proposed and approved Ordinances and Resolutions and prepares Township Board meeting agendas and packets. Clerk Debbie Swanson is always available to talk with residents, just send an email or call.

#### **MICHIGAN VOTING CHANGES**

In November 2022, Michigan voters passed a proposal that amended sections of the Michigan voting laws. The major changes included the following:

- Recognize the fundamental right to vote without harassing conduct
- Require military or overseas ballots be counted if postmarked by election day
- Provide voter right to verify identity with photo ID or signed statement
- Provide voter right to single application to vote absentee in all elections
- Require state-funded absentee-ballot drop boxes, and postage for absentee applications and ballots
- Provide that only election officials may conduct post-election audits
- Require nine days of early in-person voting for State and Federal elections
- Allow donations to fund elections, which must be disclosed
- Require canvass boards certify election results based only on the official records of votes cast.

The biggest changes include the additional absentee ballot drop boxes, changes in the absentee ballot application process, and nine days of early in-person voting for State and Federal Elections. Drop box locations will remain on Ypsilanti Township property with camera surveillance compliant with Michigan voting law for ensured security. These drop boxes will be checked regularly by Clerks' Office staff and approved election workers **ONLY**.

#### THREE WAYS TO VOTE IN MICHIGAN

#### 1. Absentee Voting:

Absentee voting is voting absent from the polls. These ballots are turned into the Clerk's Office in person, or by mail, or drop box. These ballots are stored in an envelope **signed by the voter** and are kept securely in the Clerk's Office until the votes are counted.

#### **Permanent Absent Voter List**

Voters may now check a new box on the Absent Voter Ballot Application to indicate that the voter wishes to join the Permanent Absent Voter Ballot List. The voter will automatically receive an Absent Voter Ballot before every election that they are eligible to participate in. Please note that ballots **CANNOT** be forwarded by the postal service. If you will be at a different address at the time of the election, please call the Clerk's Office to update your mailing address.

#### 2. Early In-Person Voting for State and Federal Elections:

This is different than absentee voting. It is a nine-day period of in-person early voting that always begins the second Saturday before **State and Federal** elections and ends the Sunday before an election. The voter will place their filled-in ballot through a tabulator, after which it **CANNOT** be spoiled and will remain there until the end of the day. At that time, election workers of both parties will place the ballots into a Secure Ballot Box (a secure location to place absentee ballots or applications to vote). They will seal the box. The tabulator will be "suspended" for the evening and will resume function in the morning once it has been properly inspected and the polls have been re-opened. The tabulators are programmed securely to ensure that no vote tallies can be done prior to 8pm on election day to ensure the security, the integrity, and the validity of the votes.

#### 3. Vote on Election Day At Your Polling Location:

Voting at your assigned polling location on election day will remain the same. There will be no changes to your election day polling locations at this time.

The Ypsilanti Township's Assessment Department is responsible for the annual valuation of all taxable real and personal property within the Township as of "Tax Day" (Dec. 31). All questions regarding assessments and property characteristics can be directed to the Assessment Department.

The Department conducts an annual canvass for residential and commercial/industrial properties, with the purpose of updating record card data for accuracy to estimate uniform, fair and equitable property valuations. The field staff will visit each property to verify measurements and all attributes essential to the valuation process. All Assessment Department employees are properly identifiable while in the field.

#### **Homeowners:**

- Property Transfer Affidavit (due within 45 days of a transfer of ownership)
- Principal Residence Exemption

The Principal Residence Exemption (P.R.E.) is an exemption of the 18 mills school operating for the one home you own and occupy as your primary residence. The deadline to file is June 1, for the summer tax levies.

For the convenience of all Ypsilanti Township residents, the Assessment Department invites you to submit the above forms by email to assessing@ypsitownship.org.

The Assessment Department also accepts form submissions in the gray drop-box located at the front entrance of the Tilden R. Stumbo Civic Center, but would like to remind all taxpayers that if they wish to receive a stamped copy in return, they must attach a copy with the original and provide a self-addressed envelope.

#### **Business Owners:**

- Small Business Property Tax Exemption Claim (L-5076)
- Eligible Manufacturing Personal Property Tax Exemption Claim (L-5278)

If the combined true cash value of all business personal property is less than \$80,000, your business qualifies to file a form L-5076 resulting in an exemption from personal property taxation. If you qualify as a manufacturing business, a form L-5278 can be filed with the Department. These forms are due by Feb. 20 for the year of exemption. #### Registration of Vacant Structures

Ypsilanti Township requires all vacant residential, commercial and industrial buildings to be registered and undergo annual inspections for blight and safety related issues.

#### Liquor Inspections

All businesses that serve alcohol are inspected by the Fire, Building, and Ordinance Departments for compliance with the State of Michigan licensing requirements. Businesses that sell alcohol in a retail establishment are inspected by the Ordinance Department for compliance.

#### EMERGENCY: DIAL ... 9-1-1

The Ypsilanti Township Fire Department is an emergency response agency, consisting of 28 career firefighters, operating out of three (3) stations, covering nearly 32 square miles. We participate in Automatic Mutual Aid with Pittsfield, Superior, Van Buren Townships and Ypsilanti City. We provide emergent response to fire, medical, hazardous materials, ice & swift water rescue, technical rescue and vehicle extrication calls, as well as non-emergent response to open burning complaints, non-life threatening medical, odor investigations, wires down, etc.

The Fire Department also provides prevention services that include fire safety inspections, plan reviews, site surveys, addressing, code adoption & enforcement, fire cause & origin investigations, public education demonstrations to schools & businesses, a smoke detector distribution program and participates in NHW meetings.

#### Fire Code: International Fire Code 2018

#### Fire Prevention Ordinance 2018 Requirements:

- Smoke detector for rental units & new homes
- Fire extinguisher & Carbon Monoxide detectors for rental units.

#### Smoke Detectors: 734,544,4225

The Fire Department will provide two (2) 10yr lithium powered smoke detectors for residents in need.

#### **Open Burning:**

A permit is required for any burning in the Township and issued under strict guidelines. The Fire Marshal can provide the details in order to obtain a permit & can be contacted during business hours at 734.544.4107. Please remember, the Township provides a very successful seasonal yard waste collection program.

#### **Recreational Fire Ordinance:**

You may have a recreational fire on your property without a permit if you follow the rules listed below:

■ The fire must be used to cook food for human consumption; you must use seasoned fire wood only; the fire must not create a nuisance of any kind; the fire must be constantly attended; there must be a means of extinguishment close by; all fires must be at least 50' away from any structure; no fire can be larger than 5'x5'x5'.

#### **Exceptions to Recreational Fires:**

Single-family residents are allowed to have a recreational fire as close as 15' away from their homes in an approved container: "Weber" type outdoor fireplace or a properly constructed fire pit made of metal, stone, brick or concrete.



#### **HYDRO DAM RECREATION OPPORTUNITIES**

The Ford Lake Hydroelectric Station (Hydro Dam), operating under the FERC Project #5334 is required to provide recreation opportunities to the community without discrimination.

The Hydro Dam's Recreation Plan is part of the Charter Township of Ypsilanti Parks Master Plan. Some of the amenities provided include lake access for boating and fishing, playground equipment, picnic tables and shelters.

The dam and powerhouse was part of Henry Ford Village Industries in the 1930's, built to provide electrical power to the Ford Motor Company's Ypsilanti Plant. Today, the electrical power is sold to DTE.

WCSO is happy to check on your home while you are away on vacation. Simply go to WashtenawSheriff.org and click on "How Do I" and then "Request."

- Fill out the Property/House Watch Form.
- Deputies will regularly check your home.
- If we observe any unusual activity, we will attempt to contact you or your designated contact person.
- Once you return, complete the Property/House Watch Return Form.



**Suspend subscriptions** or ask a friend or neighbor to pick up newspapers, mail and flyers so that they do not pile up outside the home.

**Provide caretakers** who will enter your home with a key. Never leave spare keys in the mailbox, under doormats or in other outdoor hiding places.

**Set timers** to turn lights, radios and televisions on and off each evening

**Avoid keeping valuables** such as jewelry or large sums of cash in the home.

**Store and lock away** recreational items normally kept outdoors (e.g., grills, bicycles, etc.).

**Never broadcast travel plans** on social media or on your voicemail.

**Notify a trusted neighbor** and ask them to keep an eye on your property.



#### Q. Sewer backing up in my house???

**A.** Call YCUA seven days a week, 24 hours a day at 734.544.7316. If the sewer main is observed to be restricted, YCUA will remedy the issue. If the sewer main is flowing properly, the homeowner will be advised to call a plumber to have their sewer lead cleaned out from the home to the sewer main.

- Q. If you observe a possible Water main break???
  - A. Call YCUA seven days a week, 24 hours a day at 734.544.7316.
- Q. How can I pay my bill???
  - **A.** You have five options to pay your bill: Pay online at www.ycua. org and click pay your bill, by phone through calling 877.885.7968 (includes a processing fee), by mail, or in person at YCUA's Main Office or the Ypsilanti Township Civic Center. 
