#### **RESOLUTION 2009-44**

WHEREAS, on January 18, 1983, the Ypsilanti Township Board established an Industrial Development District pursuant to Public Act 198, Act of 1974; and

WHEREAS, on October 30, 2009, ProQuest LLC submitted an application for an Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate regarding property within the Industrial Development District; and

WHEREAS, said application is as provided in Section 5(1) of said

Act 198 and filed in the form and manner prescribed by the State Tax

Commission; and

WHEREAS, all provisions of Section 9(1) of said Act 198 are complied with by said application and other matters investigated and considered by this Board; and

WHEREAS, the legislative body of each governmental unit which levies <u>ad valorem</u> taxes on said property has been afforded an opportunity to be heard on this matter at a public hearing held on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2009; and

WHEREAS, this Board approves the purpose behind the application for the Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate; and

WHEREAS, said Act 198 has been amended to allow local governments to enter into written agreements approving applications for Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificates; and

WHEREAS, the Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate in an amount exceeding the 5% limitation found in Section 9(1) of Act 198 shall not have the effect when considered together with the aggregate amount of Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificates previously granted and currently in force of substantially impeding the operation of local government or impairing the financial soundness of any unit of local government or any affected taxing unit.

#### **NOW THEREFORE**;

#### BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Ypsilanti Township Board approves the application of *ProQuest LLC* for an Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate in the amount of \$4,735,716 for the 7 year period, as requested, on the condition that *ProQuest LLC* enter into a written agreement with the Township, subject to approval by the Township attorney, that will insure that the objectives of Act 198 are met as it pertains to retention/creation of jobs, and furthermore provide 100% reimbursement to the taxing units affected by said abatement of all tax dollars saved as a result of said abatement if, for any reason, during the time period approved for said abatement, the tax abatement certificate is revoked, canceled or relinguished.
- 2. The Board finds that this Industrial Facilities Exemption
  Certificate, together with the aggregate amount of industrial facilities
  exemption certificates previously granted and currently in force in an
  amount exceeding the 5% limitation found in Section 9(1) of Act 198, shall
  not have the effect of substantially impeding the operation of the Charter
  Township of Ypsilanti or impairing the financial soundness of a taxing unit
  which levies an <u>ad valorem</u> property tax in the Charter Township of
  Ypsilanti in which the facility is located.
- 3. The Township Clerk is hereby directed to forward a copy of the application of *ProQuest LLC* for the Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate, together with a true copy of this Resolution approving same, to the State Tax Commission of the State of Michigan for appropriate action.

#### RESOLUTION 2009-46

Whereas, the Township's revenues have been dramatically reduced due to decreases in property values, state revenue sharing and the announced closure of the General Motors plant; and

Whereas, the Township Board understands that decreased revenue requires budget cuts; and

Whereas, effective December 31, 2009, the Township Board wishes to eliminate the current 20% pension contribution benefits of its Township Trustees and reduce the current 20% pension benefits of its three full time elected officials to 9.38%; and

Whereas, the Township's three full time elected officials will contribute the same percentage of their salaries that is contributed by the Township's full time employees under the Michigan Employment Retirement System; and

Whereas, the adoption of Ordinance 2009-400 will eliminate the pension benefits for the Trustees and reduce the pension benefits for the three full time elected officials, to be the same percentage as the pension contribution made by the Township's full time employees under the Michigan Employment Retirement System (6.9% in 2010).

Now therefore, be it resolved, that Ordinance #2009-400 is hereby adopted.

## ORDINANCE NO. 2009-400

The Charter Township of Ypsilanti hereby ordains that the Code

of Ordinances for the Charter Township of Ypsilanti is amended as

#### follows:

Sec. 2-132. Persons covered.

The annuity or pension plans created, established and contracted for under this division shall cover each person within the following classes of officers: Supervisor, Clerk and Treasurer.

Sec. 2-133. Premium contributions; date of eligibility; rejection of coverage.

(a) The township's annual contribution for the Supervisor, Clerk and Treasurer's pension benefits shall be the same percentage contributed for full time township employees under the Michigan Employment Retirement System. Such contributions shall be secured from the general fund of the township. Each person within such class of officers shall be responsible for the remainder of the premium or charges, and the township treasurer is hereby authorized to deduct the same from each person's pay, salary or compensation and to apply the same to such person's responsibility.

#### Severability

The various parts, sentences, paragraphs and clauses of this ordinance are severable. If any part, sentence, paragraph, section, or clause is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of the ordinance shall not be affected.

This Ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation as required by law.

#### Effective date

This Ordinance shall become effective upon publication in a newspaper of general circulation as required by law.

## ORDINANCE NO. 2009-401 AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2009-397

An ordinance amending Chapter 14, Article III in the Code of Ordinances for the Charter Township of Ypsilanti, Washtenaw County, Michigan

The Charter Township of Ypsilanti hereby ordains that Chapter 14 Article III, Dog Licensing and Vaccination, Section 2(a) should be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following new Section 2(a) to read as follows:

#### Article III. Dog Licensing and vaccination

#### Section 2. Fees.

(a) The annual fee for licenses purchased from the Township Treasurer or the Humane Society of Huron Valley under their pet adoption program for male and female dogs four months of age or over shall be \$6.00.

The annual fee for licenses for unlicensed and unsterilized male or female dogs four months of age or over which are impounded or boarded at the Humane Society of Huron Valley due to violations of this Chapter or state law shall be \$120.00 per year.

The annual fee for licenses for unlicensed and sterilized male or female dogs four months of age or over which are impounded or boarded at the Humane Society of Huron Valley due to violations of this Chapter or state law shall be \$20.00.

#### Severability

The various parts, sentences, paragraphs and clauses of this ordinance are severable. If any part, sentence, paragraph, section, or clause is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of the ordinance shall not be affected.

#### SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE WASHTENAW COUNTY POLICE SERVICES WITH YPSILANTI CHARTER TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, Washtenaw County ("County") the Washtenaw County Sheriff ("Sheriff") and Ypsilanti Charter Township ("Township") executed a Contract calling for the Sheriff, through its Sheriff's Office, to provide road patrol and other law enforcement services to the Township from December 5, 2006 through December 31, 2009; and

WHEREAS, the parties executed an Amendment to the Contract to extend the contract by an additional year through December 31, 2010 at a 2% increase in the contract price of police services provided under the Contract; and

WHEREAS, under the Contract, the Township currently receives and pays for 38 deputies and a pro rata price for the supervision (Sergeants and Lieutenants) for those deputies; and

WHEREAS, the Township has recently requested that the County and Sheriff agree to execute a Second Amendment to the Contract, pursuant to Article XIV, to reduce the number of contractual deputies from 38 to 31, effective from January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010;

WHEREAS, the County and Sheriff have agreed to this reduction of contract deputies.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree to amend the Police Services Contract between

## SUPPORTING THE CREATION OF A JOINT TECHNICAL COMMITTEE TO COMBINE EFFORTS IN COOPERATIVE PLANNING FOR WASHTENAW AVENUE CORRIDOR

WHEREAS, representatives of the Cities of Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti, the Townships of Pittsfield and Ypsilanti ("the group") have been meeting since early 2009 discussing common issues and expressing a desire to implement a common planning process to encourage smart redevelopment along Washtenaw Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Ann Arbor Transportation Authority (AATA), Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) and Washtenaw Area Transportation Study (WATS) have participated in these meetings; and

WHEREAS current practices along this corridor encourage sprawling and segregated land uses, automobile-dependency, reduced property value and higher than average vacancy rates; and

WHEREAS, the group has recognized need for common planning to shift the type and level of investment in the corridor and as such have agreed to work together to enhance cooperative planning efforts; and

WHEREAS, the group recognizes that providing multi-modal transportation options to the public will become increasingly important as oil resources diminish, sustainable land use consciousness rises, health consciousness rises, the population ages, and the negative effects of carbon emissions grow as a public concern; and

WHEREAS, this group has envisioned the redevelopment of the auto-corridor into a transit corridor with mixed land uses connected by multi-modal transportation options; and

WHEREAS, this type of development attracts private investment, talent and jobs to the region; and

WHEREAS, the communities recognize the opportunity and necessity to plan now in order to be proactive and prepared for any future periods of rapid development; and

WHEREAS, a Joint Technical Committee would provide an productive tool to identify which common planning process would most benefit the region and to further these goals; and

WHEREAS, the Joint Technical Committee will include one planning and one elected representative from the jurisdictions and one representative from each of the transportation agencies; and

WHEREAS, the work of the Joint Technical Committee will be ongoing due to the long term nature of this project; and

WHEREAS, the planning process and the resulting implementation actions can result in a model for intergovernmental planning and cooperation and corridor redevelopment.
