All fire department response personnel are licensed as emergency medical technicians by the State of Michigan Public Health. 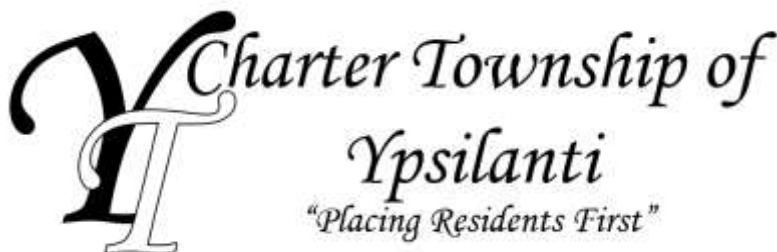

The items below are projects that the Human Resource Department is currently working on in addition to the day to day operations of the department.

- Advertisements for both the Floater II/Clerk III position that will be shared 80% Treasurer's Office 20% Clerk's office; and the Building Attendant position have been posted external. Posting is appearing on the Township's web-site, Ann Arbor.com, HotJobs.com, the Thursday, January 13th, printed edition of the Ypsilanti Courier and was in the Sunday, January 9th printed edition of the Ann Arbor News. Closing date for both positions is Friday, January 21st.
- Intern for Planning Department: Mr. James Howell met with Joe Lawson from Planning and will begin an unpaid internship on Tuesday, January 18th. Mr. Howell will be graduating from Eastern Michigan in May 2011 with a Master of Science in Urban and Regional Planning.
- Processed all health care open enrollment changes.
- Coordinated a Loan Option for all employees that participate in the optional 457 Nationwide Retirement Program. This will allow employees to take loans from their accounts and arrange with Nationwide directly the repayment. This was an addition to our current plan at no cost to the Township, but could be very beneficial to our employees during these difficult times.
- BASIC Flex: Contacted our BASIC Flex representative in regard to adding the option for Premium Contribution Coverage. This would allow employees that contribute toward their monthly health care premium the ability to do it pre-taxed. This benefit is in addition to our current options through BASIC and adds no additional cost for the Township.

Re: **Planning Division (OCS) December, 2010 report**

Please be advised of the following activities related to the Planning Department for December 2010.

Planning Commission Activity

In December, the Planning Commission had two action items included on their agenda. The first item was a request for a special conditional use permit for the establishment of a group daycare home to be located at 7110 LaPaloma Lane. A group daycare home is a home based daycare providing care for up to 12 children. By ordinance, this use requires the issuance of a special conditional use by the Planning Commission. After the public hearing was held, the Commission approved a motion to table the request to allow the applicant an opportunity to resolve an issue relating to the outdoor play area. Ordinance requires that the outdoor play area be enclosed by a 4-foot tall fence. In this particular case, no fence was present in the play area. This item will return for action once the applicant has installed the required fencing.

The second item before the Commission was a resolution of support for the Re-Imagine Washtenaw Avenue Plan. It was requested by the Board of Trustees that the Planning Commission review and offer comment relating to this project prior to Board consideration. During the meeting, the Planning Commission moved a resolution of support which was forwarded to the Board of Trustees for consideration.

Plans in Process

The Ypsilanti Area Federal Credit Union received a temporary certificate of occupancy due to a number of site related issues that remain outstanding. A final site inspection will occur this spring and a final punch list created. It will be required that the contractor resolve all noted site related issues and any noted building code issues prior to the issuance of a final certificate of occupancy.

The Dean Drive – Morgan Road Extension project is nearly complete. The contractor was able to get all but the final course of asphalt laid prior to the cold weather setting in. The road are scheduled to open this spring once the contractor is able to install the final wear course and perform the final stabilization of the site. Once this occurs, the Washtenaw County Road Commission will inspect and hopefully approve the project as a public road.

Staffs, along with Township Attorney McLain, continue to work toward a resolution regarding the property located at 1854 Cadillac Street (a.k.a. the Chris Kind Project). As you may be aware, this project remains under a strict timeline that has been documented within a court order signed by Circuit Court Judge Swartz. The preliminary site plan was presented to the Planning Commission during their regularly scheduled October meeting date and was subsequently tabled due to a number of issues. Currently, Mr. Kind is under order to obtain preliminary site plan approval prior to the scheduled February 2, 2011 review hearing before Judge Swartz. A revised preliminary site plan has been submitted to this department and is currently under review. The revised plan will once again be presented to the Planning Commission for review and consideration prior to the upcoming review hearing.

Zoning Board of Appeals

During the regularly scheduled November meeting, the Zoning Board considered two applications. The first application was for a temporary use permit to allow for the hosting of the 2011 carnival and fireworks display to be held at the Lakeshore Apartment Complex. This year the event will be held from June 30th through July 4th.

The second application was for a temporary use permit to allow the Lakeshore Apartment group to host the Kelly Miller Circus. The circus is proposed to be held on August 13, 2011.

Both applications were approved during this meeting. The Zoning Board also approved the 2011 meeting dates during said meeting.

Committee Meetings

Staff along with Supervisor Stumbo and Clerk Roe continues to participate in meetings relating to the Re-Imagine Washtenaw project. As you are well aware, the committee has requested and received motions of approval to move the project forward in 2011. A public hearing to consider the establishment of a Corridor Improvement Authority has been scheduled before the Board on March 1, 2011.

In December, a new committee group was formed in relation to the Complete Streets initiative. This committee includes many of the participating WATS communities, Washtenaw County, the State of Michigan and other Washtenaw County activist groups. The group will continue to meet once a month through 2011 to support and recommend regulations relating to the complete streets program.

Administrative Items:

As the 2010 calendar year comes to a close, staff continues to work on the year end reports that will be presented to the Board of Trustees in the upcoming weeks. The Planning Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals reports will be presented to those bodies for approval prior to their presentation to the Board of Trustees. I anticipate the presentation of said reports to the Board during their regular February meeting date.

As was approved as part of the 2011 Budget, the Planning Department has begun the process of the 2011-2012 Township Master Plan Update. As is required by the State Planning Act, a community must revisit their adopted master plan every 5 years. As our current plan was adopted in 2007, it will be scheduled for a re-visit by no later than 2012. With that said a request for meeting has been sent to Jeff Purdy of LSL Planning to compose a timeline for this process, so that said timeline may be presented to the Planning Commission and Township Board. I hope to have this process completed prior to the second February meeting date of the Commission and Board.

PUBLIC SERVICES SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

January 2011

There are several items that we are currently working on throughout the township.

We check the parking lot and sidewalks daily for ice, or snow, prior to the township buildings opening.

We began cleaning up the property off of Glenwood by trimming trees and clearing brush. It is difficult to get much completed with the snow cover but we will continue to work on it when the weather permits.

We began servicing one of the skid steers by changing the engine oil, the hydraulic oil, and the drive chain oil on each side. We have also applied a rust inhibitor to the exterior since it is our primary piece of equipment used for loading the salt that we use in the parking lots. This process will hopefully help this piece of equipment last for several more years.

We are also servicing all of our mowing equipment to prepare it for the upcoming season. We have a total of 7 machines that we use for mowing. As of today we have changed the oil and air filters in 3 machines.

I have had the township vehicles that are not utilized on a daily basis moved to the Civic Center Garage so that we may evaluate their condition. We do have a few vehicles that we may wish to auction off in the future but we will wait until all of the vehicles have been evaluated.

We are also working with Starcraft to address the noise interference when utilizing the DVD system on the bus. Starcraft is the

manufacturer of the body. We have already had our annual inspection of the bus and are ready for another season.

Unfortunately, our Mechanic, Aaron Lyles will be out for several weeks recovering from surgery. This is a great loss but we will continue to manage and get as much completed that we can.

We had several new signs installed around several of our parks including new park name signs in, Watertower, Hewen's Creek, and Bud & Blossom. They also installed new signage pertaining to the park rules in many of the other parks.

Curbside collection of yard waste has been suspended since the first week of December 2010. As of December 1, 2010, 80 cubic yards of material had been received with \$920.00 billed.

Our residents have dropped off 4,020.68 cubic yards of material for the 2010 year with only 96.83 cubic yards for December. The amount billed for December was \$1,113.55.

Our chipping operation has been suspended for the season since November and therefore no material report is available. We will resume brush pick up in April.

As of January 10th, 2011, I have reassigned the Parks & Grounds staff and the Environmental Services staff to the Civic Center Garage from the Ford Lake Park Garage. This will allow us to work in a larger facility while being able to service the Civic Center with greater ease. At this time the move is temporary.

Our Building Operations staff is busy keeping our buildings up and running while also addressing smaller issues. They have helped set up rooms, shovel snow, move pool tables, re-hang lights, and maintain our safety equipment. We are also investigating what would be involved with making some of the buildings that are not part of the energy reducing project more efficient. Adding insulation where we can and sealing cracks around windows & doors.

In spite of a reduced amount of work days around the holiday time period, the department has been quite busy with many different projects.

A couple of projects have been conducted on part of the Hydro Dam operation. This includes an EAP (Emergency Action Plan) review and a security review for the operation. The EAP included a couple of meetings locally here but the final exercise was conducted in conjunction with the County's Emergency Office. The security plan involved a tour of all the potential access points to the building with the police and others.

I have met with Honeywell representatives many times over the past month with regard to the energy efficiency project work. To this point, the toilets, urinal and faucets have already been replaced

at the Community Center. The workers are currently working in the Police Station and the Court replacing the same.

I met with Washtenaw County and the City of Ann Arbor on the PACE legislation that the governor signed into law last month. This should be the impetus to allow us the opportunity to make a better decision on using our last 10 % funding from the EECBG.

I also met with a lot of the same players as above so everyone could share their energy savings updates. Ann Arbor is very big in utilizing LED lights, especially for their street lights. At this point, we are observing the success of their program and work out the difficulties before going forward.

Michael Saranen and I went to the HVA offices to discuss their operation and how they could benefit us in the event of a major dam failure. We asked Chief Copeland to bring the Code Spear request to the board that would essentially be covered under the Fire Departments existing agreement with HVA. They also gave us a tour of their facility which was quite impressive with the amount of employees and size of the fleet they run at this site. I had no idea they cover the amount of Southeast Michigan that they do.

I delivered the Connecting Communities grant request to the Washtenaw County Parks and Recreation offices. It is our expectation that we would hear something back from them by the end of March.

I met with Jenn Lawson of ECT to discuss the current litigation of our storm water permit as it stands in Lansing. Apparently, we now can operate under our old permit and would not be required to follow the new permit until the issue is resolved. We did file our revised SWPPI plan with the state as we agreed upon with Rachel Matthews of the MDNRE.

In conjunction of the Connecting Communities Grant, I did mail an easement request to 2 residents of Textile Rd. I did meet with one resident shortly thereafter and he is still not interested in granting an easement for the purpose of a bike path.

Ann Arbor officials and Larry Doe and I met with regard to the PACE legislation approval in order for everyone to be on the same page with regard to how this new law is supposed to work. Larry indicated he would be meeting with Catherine McClary, the county treasurer to get her thoughts on the matter.

The quarterly report of the EECBG project was due today and I filed the appropriate paperwork on federalreporting.gov. We have to continue to report this even though we are complete on the project at the Civic Center, because we still have the other 10% held aside for a potential revolving loan fund.

We plan on starting a tree trimming program in the next couple of weeks, weather permitting. We have contacted YCUA and have secured use of their bucket truck (aka as a cherry picker). We have 2 employees in the maintenance department that are certified in lift truck operations and we plan on using them when not doing maintenance projects or snow removal. YCUA has agreed to charge us \$54/ hour for use of their truck and they will only bill us for the hours that we use it. We estimate this may cost us in the area of about \$300 per day considering that we would have to go to pick it up daily and drop it off. I have surveyed an area in Gault Village and the Sugarbrook neighborhoods and have quite a list of trees that need trimming in order to allow enough light through. At the current time, we (residents) are paying for street lights and not all of the light is able to be used- due to the trees blocking many of the fixtures. This has become an increasing problem of security in these neighborhoods. After the trimming work, we would go behind them and use our chippers to clean up the streets

and utilize the chips at the Compost Site. I will keep you updated on this project as we move along in the process. We have budgeted \$15,000 for this work in the 101.956.000.926.100 account line item.

The Hydro Station continues to operate safely and continues to get routine safety inspections and preventive maintenance. Operators had 2 call-ins for the month for computer related issues.

General Summary:

December's weather was cooler than average. Rainfall total was about .2" and snow totals were about 7". Production still remained below normal for the month because of the lack of precipitation. A late warm up during the last couple of days did provide some relief but was not enough to make up for the lack of water flow.

A Generator Management Relay (GMR) failed during the holiday break. This failure reduced the ability to use both generators if

needed. Operators were able to reprogram the other GMR to allow the use of the appropriate generator to maximize efficiency. This task however was not easy since the hydro computer's GE489 software will not open. This was overcome by using a personal notebook from home.

Regulatory Update:

The FERC has requested the Township to evaluate the items to help reduce the time in responding during a dam failure emergency. The final evaluation was filed with the FERC. The department has updated the Emergency Plan and will work with Township staff and responders on retraining and distributing the updated Plan.

Shoreline Erosion Survey Report was completed filed for comment with the resource agencies. No major findings were observed during the survey. A final report will include comments that are received from the resource agencies and then submitted to the FERC.

Nuisance Plant Survey- Annual survey to monitor Purple Loosestrife and Emersion Water Milfoil throughout the lake was done in July. As part of the process, Purple Loosestrife is removed by hand pulling from Township lands along the lake. 2010 is the fifth year for the reporting requirement and an additional overall summary of conditions will be included in the report. Surveys over the past five years show that Purple Loosestrife is spreading across the lake. We have had discussions internally and with MDEQ and MDOT about a possible beetle release project for 2011. The report will be completed and submitted to the resource agencies for comment before filing with the FERC.

The 5 year safety inspection report is now complete and filed with the FERC. The report recommended 2 survey monitoring points should be established in frost free ground and then recheck next year. As part of this report a dive inspection was completed in the tailrace of the dam. The inspection results are satisfactory. The project's monitoring plan was updated and a supplemental report was filed with the FERC. As recommended by the safety inspection 2 monuments were installed in frost free earth. Wildlife Survey was conducted. A formal report will be file with the resource agencies with the findings. Overall, the plan has not been very successful attracting target birds and ducks.

Security Program is in the process of being updating the plan and completing assessment recommendations. This is a requirement of FERC.

Other:

The hydro purchased a used backhoe to replace a 30 year old model that is utilized by township departments. It is an important piece of equipment since it is part of the hydro's emergency plan.

WQ buoys were removed from service and stored for the winter. Sensors will be serviced over the winter.

MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER 21, 2010 WORK SESSION**

Supervisor Brenda L. Stumbo called the meeting to order at approximately 6:00 p.m. in the Ypsilanti Township Civic Center Board Room, 7200 S. Huron River Drive, Ypsilanti Township.

Members Present: Supervisor Brenda L. Stumbo, Clerk Karen Lovejoy Roe, Treasurer Larry Doe, Trustees Stan Eldridge, Jean Hall Currie and Mike Martin

Legal Counsel: Wm. Douglas Winters

Supervisor Stumbo announced this was the last Board Work Session. In January, meetings would begin at 6:30 p.m. and all discussion would take place at the board meeting. She clarified that the meetings would still be held on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of the month with the exception of the summer meetings.

A. DISCUSS IF 63 PARCELS AT LIBERTY SQUARE SHOULD BE DEEDED TO YPSILANTI TOWNSHIP OR WASHTENAW COUNTY

Supervisor Stumbo stated Attorney Winters was running late and he requested this item be discussed upon his arrival.

SUPERVISOR UPDATE

Supervisor Stumbo said on Resolution 2010-30, Creation of the Joint Improvement Authority the public hearing date was changed to March 1, 2011.

Supervisor Stumbo explained that the Solid Waste Department did a mailing every year to provide residents information on garbage pickup, recycling, compost and other valuable services, which also included an informational magnet. Staff had researched and received quotes on a pamphlet-type mailer that would include all the previous information, departmental information and answers to questions frequently asked by residents. She further explained the pamphlet could be mailed to residents and could also be distributed to new residents. Supervisor Stumbo stated three quotes were received and she asked the Board if they wanted to proceed or have the information brought back to the meeting in January. She stated the information needed to be mailed by the end of January.

Treasurer Doe said since three quotes had been received, it would be easier to proceed now and not wait until January.

**1. DISCUSS IF 63 PARCELS AT LIBERTY SQUARE SHOULD BE DEEDED TO
YPSILANTI TOWNSHIP OR WASHTENAW COUNTY**

Attorney Winters stated the Township was approached by Catherine McClary, Washtenaw County Treasurer regarding 63 units in Liberty Square. He explained the condominium development was currently in suit with the Township, which would have been filed in the previous week but because the units were individually owned, it required individual summons. Attorney Winters said the County had foreclosed on 63 units and had gone through every possible sale requirement. He further explained since there were no bidders, the units could go to the Township and if the Township declined, the units would go to the County. Attorney Winters explained that if the units went to the County, they could be used for any purpose, with no public restriction. If the Township took possession, he believed the Township would proceed with litigation in terms of obtaining total control of the development for possible demolition through grant money. Attorney Winters said it was unlikely that someone would restore the development.

Mike Radzik, OCS Director stated additional units were kicked open and required boarding-up. He said DTE had discovered multiple underground natural gas leaks, which required them to cut and cap two or three entire buildings on Morris Street.

Attorney Winters stressed that the Township would have to deal with the issues whether the Township owned the units or the County owned them. He said more control the Township had over the development, the more say so the Township would have over the development's ultimate fate. Attorney Winters reminded the Board there were no strings attached in regard to the use of the property and he recommended the Board have the 63 units deeded to the Township.

Supervisor Stumbo said she feared the County could rehab the units and put in a prisoner reentry program or something else the community would not want at that location. She said in February, there would be 34 additional units facing tax foreclosure. Supervisor Stumbo said she first thought rehabbing the development would be best but the property is an attractive nuisance for crime activity. She said she felt it would be better to demolish the units and possibly sell the property for redevelopment. If the Township allowed someone else to take the property, anything could go in the location.

Ms. Kaiser asked what it would cost the Township to take the property.

Supervisor Stumbo stated the Township would get the property at no cost.

Attorney Winters said it showed just how bad the property was, when no one would buy it at the tax sale. He said the Township was stuck with responding to the development when issues arose and added, the property was a main entryway into the Township from Rawsonville Road. Attorney Winters stressed the more control the Township had, the more resources that could be saved.

Clerk Lovejoy Roe said the 63 units did not give the Township majority control and asked if the additional 34 units would provide the majority control.

Attorney Winters explained that 140 units would give the Township majority control but he said the problem was the 63 units were not contiguous and were spread throughout the development. Attorney Winters stated it was like a jigsaw puzzle and eventually, the Township would have the ability to do partial demolitions and partial closures. He said in the 26 years that he had been the Township attorney, there had not been one year without an issue at Liberty Square. Attorney Winters said the Liberty Square development had been a drain on Township resources and this was an opportunity to do something different with the property.

Treasurer Doe said under the assumption that the Township obtained all the units, where would funding come from for demolition and what liability would the Township have to follow Township ordinances.

Attorney Winters stated that currently there was no funding available for demolition and he thought it would be necessary to get assistance from the Federal government. He said it might require the creation of new ordinances because this undertaking would be new territory and the Township would obviously not install new windows and doors. He said it was a no win situation because if the Township did nothing, there would still be the same problems. Attorney Winters stated that residents were storing garbage in the vacant units, which would create a rat problem if one did not already exist. He stressed that doing nothing was not an option.

Supervisor Stumbo stated if the Township did nothing, then the County would do something.

Clerk Lovejoy Roe said if the Township owned the parcels, there was always the possibility of being approached by a developer.

Trustee Martin said if the County obtains the property, what they did with it would be outside of the Township's control and he did not like that prospect.

Mr. Radzik said the County had to act by the end of the year and due to the holiday schedule, the County would inquire about the Board's decision on Wednesday.

The Board agreed to place approval of deeding the 63 parcels in Liberty Square to Ypsilanti Township on the Board agenda under Other Business.

Supervisor Stumbo stated the Board had agreed to add two items to the agenda under Other Business. She said she and Clerk Lovejoy Roe had written up a motion for the printing of the pamphlet, which was to authorize the design of bid specifications, approve seeking three quotes, authorize acceptance of lowest quote and to approve mailing costs, with a budget amendment brought back to the Board at the next meeting.

Attorney Winters reiterated that if the County obtained Liberty Square, the Township would not have any control over what they did with the property.

Ms. Kaiser stated with Aerotropolis and trying to build up Willow Run, it would be prime property.

Clerk Lovejoy Roe said there had been discussion that if there were access to the bank and to Burger King from this property, there would be direct access to Rawsonville Road.

Supervisor Stumbo asked Attorney Winters if the motion should be to accept 63 parcels at Liberty Square from the County for tax foreclosure.

Attorney Winters stated the motion should be to accept the transfer of the 63 units from the Washtenaw County Treasurer to the Township, subject to all the paperwork being reviewed by the Township Attorney with no money being expended to make the transfer. He said there might be a recording fee but nothing in the terms of back taxes.

Supervisor Stumbo stated there was a fire fatality at 1231 Rambling Road. She said there was concern that the structure would fall and children were playing underneath the porch overhang area. She said the Attorney had been in contact with the insurance company and an investigation was being completed.

Attorney Winters said the next-door neighbor was adversely impacted because she had initially allowed the property to be braced but she cannot use her driveway. He said it was a rental unit and the owner lived in Arizona.

Supervisor Stumbo this would be their 20th Anniversary Celebration and they wanted to utilize the Township boardroom.

Karen Wallin, Human Resources stated the Township was not obligated but, out of courtesy, laid-off employees could be notified.

Supervisor Stumbo said she had contacted the employee in question about the opening in the Treasurer's office.

Trustee Currie agreed that laid-off employees should be contacted and given priority to the open positions.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor Brenda L. Stumbo at approximately 7:00 p.m. in the Ypsilanti Township Civic Center Board Room, 7200 S. Huron River Drive, Ypsilanti Township. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silent prayer was observed.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Arloa Kaiser, Township Resident said she had a conversation before the meeting regarding checking into money that was being spent for things like paid lunch hours, Trustees that were not attending the meetings, looking into having a core group of firefighters, with other firefighters on call and the firefighter's nutritionist. She said taxpayers should not have to pay for trivial things.

Stan McGara, Township Resident said it was nice to see some of the Board Members at the senior's Christmas dinner. He said in regard to filling positions, he would like the Township to consider engineering training or making it a future job requirement so it would not be necessary to go to outside contractors.

MINUTES

B. DECEMBER 7, 2010 WORK SESSION AND REGULAR MEETING

A motion was made by Trustee Currie, supported by Clerk Lovejoy Roe to approve the minutes of the November 29, 2010 Special Meeting and the December 7, 2010 Work Session and Regular Meeting. The motion carried unanimously.

Trustee Eldridge stated in the December 7, 2010 Work Session minutes, there was no response to his question about adding more details to the minutes. He said it was not agreed as a Board, that more details would be added to the minutes (hard copy) so residents that did not have a computer could have them.

Clerk Lovejoy Roe stated she had agreed and more detail had been added, She said she thought he was saying there was not enough detail in the minutes but the minutes were pretty extensive.

SUPERVISOR REPORT

Supervisor Stumbo said she attended a meeting with Washtenaw County, Wayne County and SPARK regarding Aerotropolis and there was a lot of collaboration organized with Wayne County. She said the meeting also included local elected officials from VanBuren Township, Sumpter Township and Belleville.

Supervisor Stumbo stated she, Trustees Currie and Eldridge, Clerk Lovejoy Roe and Treasurer Doe attended the senior's Holiday Luncheon. She said it was a beautiful event.

Supervisor Stumbo said three full-time officials attended the LDFA meeting, which was the Local Development Finance Authority.

Supervisor Stumbo stated the full-time officials and Linda Gosselin, Assessor met with Ford Motor Company regarding a potential settlement on the tax issues. She said the Township had spent over \$500,000 on the Ford tax appeal and the proposed settlement agreement would be on the next Board agenda. She further explained that Ford had requested a 40% reduction but the Assessor, based on her knowledge of what other communities had settled offered a 20% reduction. Supervisor Stumbo further explained that nothing had been resolved in the two meetings but Ford called and wanted to settle before the end of the year. She said it appeared that the issue would finally be resolved.

Supervisor Stumbo said she interviewed with Charlie LaDuff from Fox 2 News regarding the closing of the Willow Run transmission plant and the interview would air on December 23, 2010. She stated she did not think that people really understood what it meant to our community, to our residents and to our businesses. Supervisor Stumbo stressed it would have a huge domino effect but it would be necessary to pull ourselves back up and find new ways to get new businesses. She further stated that our residents needed jobs and she thought manufacturing was the answer.

Supervisor Stumbo said the West Willow Neighborhood Watch Association was considering adopting a park.

Supervisor Stumbo said the background check on the Accounting Director was complete and she introduced Jovanna Neel, the new Accounting Director.

Ms. Neel thanked the Board for the opportunity to be the Accounting Director and she looked forward to working with everyone. Ms. Neel stated she graduated from Eastern

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Michigan in 2001 and she worked for Plant Moran until 2007, when she went to work for the City of Hamtramck. She said she had lived in Ypsilanti for 20 years. Ms. Neal again thanked the Board for the opportunity.

Supervisor Stumbo stated it was Chris Olshelske's last Board meeting and she told her it had been a pleasure working with her. She said she had done a great job and hoped she would get involved in some Township committees. Supervisor Stumbo explained that Ms. Olshelske would be working with Ms. Neal during the Christmas shutdown to prepare to take over in January.

Supervisor Stumbo explained there was a fire fatality and the Chief had reminded her that this was the third fatality on his watch. She said the victim was an eighteen year old and there were no smoke detectors in the home. Supervisor Stumbo stated the utilities had been shut off but the tenants had reconnected the gas and that was believed to be what spurred the fire. She said the Chief had contacted DTE regarding notification of a utility shut-off.

Chief Copeland stated the circumstances surrounding the fatality in January were similar to what happen on Rambling Road. He said the utilities were off, there were no smoke detectors and the tenants were using a propane cylinder with a heating element on top. Chief Copeland said he was collaborating with WalMart to do community service that would help provide additional smoke detectors. He said he wanted to make sure this did not happen again and it was his hope that they would come up with a plan that would reduce or eliminate fire death in the community.

Supervisor Stumbo stated that ISSYS, which was one of the companies that received a tax abatement, had received two Federal grants. She said one to aide in the support of the wireless, implantable pressure sensors for the chronic treatment of congestive heart failure and the other for a drug infusion-flow sensing technology for much safer drug administration. Supervisor Stumbo stated eventually these items would be manufactured and it could create jobs in the future.

Supervisor Stumbo said the park signs were installed. She said it was a tough year but a good year. Supervisor Stumbo stated the employees had done an excellent job and the Board was thankful for everything they did. She said the Board had worked well together and had worked hard to serve the residents in these trying times. Supervisor Stumbo stated she looked forward to 2011.

CLERK REPORT

Clerk Lovejoy Roe stated there would be a millage election on May 3, 2011 for the Washtenaw Intermediate School District.

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Clerk Lovejoy Roe congratulated Chris Olshelske on her retirement and expressed her appreciation for the great job she had done.

Clerk Lovejoy Roe said she knew it was early but she felt she needed to clarify her position. She stated she had been asked about five times, one by a County Commissioner if she was running for Supervisor. Clerk Lovejoy Roe announced that she planned to seek the office of Clerk in 2012, that she loved her job and it had never crossed her mind to run for Supervisor. Clerk Lovejoy Roe stressed that Supervisor Stumbo was doing a great job. She wanted it on the public record that she planned to put her name on the ballot for Clerk in 2012.

Clerk Lovejoy Roe said it had been a great year, the Board was a great Board to work with and the employees had done a knockout job. She also thanked the residents for attending the Board meetings.

TREASURER REPORT

A. NOVEMBER 2010

A motion was made by Clerk Lovejoy Roe, supported by Trustee Eldridge to receive and file the November 2010 Treasurer's report (see attached). The motion carried unanimously.

Treasurer Doe wished Chris Olshelske the best of luck on her retirement and he said it had been a pleasure working with her.

TRUSTEE REPORT

Trustee Martin said he and Mike Radzik, OCS Director had met with the Human Society to discuss expanding the current dog nuisance ordinance that would contain language on backyard breeding, which would require a breeding permit and would not allow breeding in residential areas, expanding accountability for irresponsible dog owners and possible spay/neutering for all dogs in the Township. He said they were using ordinances from other communities as a template to build on.

Trustee Currie congratulated Chris Olshelske on her retirement and thanked her for being part of the Township.

Trustee Eldridge asked that the Board be provided monthly departmental reports for all the departments. He said there were several that were missed consistently and he felt if they were going to get them every month, then every department should be doing them.

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Trustee Eldridge stated the Police Services Committee had met with the consultant and discussed the project scope, the mission of what would be accomplished, his work plans, the liaison responsibility was setup, the schedule was put together and discussed the similarities and differences between the two communities. He said the meetings were getting better and more comprehensive each time they met.

Attorney Winters stated he felt they had definitely chosen the right person to do the study. He said it was exciting to be doing something so positive for the community.

Mike Radzik, OCS Director stated that after the meeting, he and Chief Walker spent a couple of hours with Mr. Henchel touring the City and Township police facilities. He said they both gave Mr. Henchel binders of information, so the exchange of data had begun.

Trustee Eldridge said he had requested that Travis McDugald, IS Manager attend the Board meeting. He said he would like, if the Board approved, to meet with Mr. McDugald to explore his concern regarding the social networking sites and how they might be better monitored. He said there had already been incidents in the Township that were less than positive in light for the Township. Trustee Eldridge said his intent was to make sure that employee's personal networking sites were not being used during work hours. He said he felt the Township had the responsibility to make sure they were monitoring what went on during the workday. Trustee Eldridge asked if the Board had any objection to him meeting with Mr. Radzik and Mr. McDugald to discuss a better way of monitoring usage on a Township-wide basis.

Supervisor Stumbo said the only thing she would like to add was that maybe they should see if there was a problem.

Trustee Eldridge said he was not insinuating that there was a problem but his concern was if employees were on paid work time, they should not be on personal networking sites. He said he was trying to be proactive and not reactive.

Supervisor Stumbo said the internet policy could be reviewed to see if there were needed changes. She said she was not opposed to Trustee Eldridge meeting with Mr. Radzik and Mr. McDugald.

Trustee Eldridge said that as long as no one objected, he planned to meet after the first of the year to see if they could find something and he would bring it back to the Board to discuss. He wished Chris Olshelske the best in her retirement.

Ms. Olshelske said it had been a wonderful ten years and she really appreciated everything. She said as much as she wanted to retire, it was very difficult to leave. Ms. Olshelske stated she felt the Board would be very happy with Ms. Neel and if Ms. Neel needed anything, she would be there to help.

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Trustee Eldridge said he had a discussion with Human Resources, the Treasurer, the Clerk and her deputy. He said the Board approved a position two weeks ago but he philosophically had difficulty approving split positions between two departments. Trustee Eldridge stated he did not think it was in the best interest of employees and as they move forward, he would prefer to see employees 100 percent in a department.

A motion was made by Clerk Lovejoy Roe, supported by Treasurer Doe to authorize legal action if necessary, in Washtenaw County Circuit Court to abate public nuisance for properties located at 1231 Rambling Road and 2147 Moeller Avenue. The motion carried unanimously.

Attorney Winters provided an overview of the condition of the properties located at 1231 Rambling Road and 2147 Moeller Avenue, accompanied by a photo presentation.

Supervisor Stumbo stated the Township was now notified of fires and was being proactive in making sure that no street had to deal with the type of situation shown in the presentation. She said insurance companies provided dollars to make sure the homes were demolished or they were taken to court to make it happen. Supervisor Stumbo said with all the vacant buildings, it was important to identify them. She said she loved the Chief's idea of having DTE notify him of shut-off locations because the building department could be notified and they could verify the home was not being occupied. Supervisor Stumbo stated it may be labor intensive but it could help prevent future fatalities and criminal activity.

Clerk Lovejoy Roe stated she just learned on the statewide Clerk's list serve that many communities were unaware of the law that would require insurance companies to hold a percentage of the insurance when a fire had occurred. She thanked Attorney Winters for keeping on top of all the legal issues and what could benefit the residents.

C. GENERAL LEGAL UPDATE

Attorney Winters provided an overview and update on Ypsi Mobile Village accompanied by a six minute video taken by Mr. Radzik and the park location. He said a ruling was

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expected from the bankruptcy court on whether or not the case would be returned to Judge Shelton. Attorney Winters stated the mobile home park was located in a busy, commercial corridor where a significant amount of resources had been expended in the clean-up, as well as dealing with the prostitution and drug related issues.

Clerk Lovejoy Roe asked if the Township was working with members of the Mobile Home Commission or with staff.

Attorney Winters explained the Department of Energy and Labor and Economic Growth was the department that oversaw the mobile home park licenses, have the authority to issue sanctions and to hold revocation hearings. He said in this case, a revocation hearing was not necessary because the owner told the State he was abandoning the park. Attorney Winters stated that even with that admission from the owner the license was not revoked. He said no one could understand the inaction by the State. Attorney Winters stated he was going about it at the State level, Circuit Court level and the Bankruptcy Court level so it will get cleaned up eventually. It was discussed with David Rutledge, State Representative about introducing legislation that would require mobile home operators to put up a letter of credit so if the owner decided to walk away, there would be some dollars to access.

Attorney Winters stated on a final note with him personally, as McLain and Winters starts their 27th year as Township Attorney, it had been an honor and privilege for his firm to serve as the general counsel to the Township. He said he grew up in the area, he loved the Township, he loved fighting for the Township and this Board had dealt with things that had not been seen in previous administrations. Attorney Winters thanked the Board for the confidence they had always shown the firm and they would continue to fight the good fight and make Ypsilanti Township proud and make Ypsilanti Township a good place for economic development to occur.

Supervisor Stumbo recognized Washtenaw County Road Commissioner, Fred Viegel.

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Supervisor Stumbo said Veterans originally tried to locate the memorial wall in Veteran's Park in Ann Arbor but Ann Arbor did not want it there. She said there was a lot of history on how the Township obtained the memorial and she was sure that information would be provided at the celebration. Supervisor Stumbo said Ann Arbor's loss was Ypsilanti Township's gain. She stressed the wall was a great additional and tradition of year at the memorial site.

2. BUDGET AMENDMENT #14

A motion was made by Clerk Lovejoy Roe, supported by Treasurer Doe to approve Budget Amendment #14 (see attached). The motion carried unanimously.

Clerk Lovejoy Roe read Budget Amendment #14 into the record. There was no further discussion.

3. CLARIFICATION OF NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH COORDINATOR POSITION

Supervisor Stumbo stated the appointment was to see if the Deputy Supervisor could do the Neighborhood Watch job in the evening and compensation was given. The Human Resource Department said the position would be brought back to the Board in December and the memo was to also clarify statements that were made at the last meeting. Supervisor Stumbo stated she was startled that some questions asked at the meeting were not asked before hand. She stressed that she did respect the Board's right to disagreed. Supervisor Stumbo said the three full-time officials would be meeting every Monday to discuss agenda items and any other Township issue. She told Deputy Keen that she was doing an excellent job as the Neighborhood Watch Coordinator and it was greatly appreciated. Supervisor Stumbo read the detailed memo into the record.

A motion was made by Trustee Eldridge, supported by Trustee Martin to approve the clarification of the Neighborhood Watch Coordinator position and the salary (see attached).The motion carried unanimously.

Clerk Lovejoy Roe said she wanted to raise the issue she raised before and she said she knew Ms. Keen did a tremendous job. She said she was not privy to the information in the beginning and maybe if she had been, the numbers could have been calculated. Clerk Lovejoy Roe stated she did not know the original agreement with Ms. Keen was to give her \$150 a week take home.

Supervisor Stumbo clarified that it was supposed to be \$100 a week take home.

Clerk Lovejoy Roe said she thought it was \$150.

Supervisor Stumbo stated it was \$77 and now it was \$100. She said it was \$7,800 so it was under the \$8,000 originally stated by Clerk Lovejoy Roe.

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Clerk Lovejoy Roe said when it was approved in August, it was approximately \$6,000 and she said that was the surprised because no one had said anything about the original agreement for \$100 She stated that was not the traditional way to look at raises because people could change their take home by changing their exemptions. She said because she was unaware of the original agreement, it looked like there was a 12% raise in August and then three months later, an additional \$2,000 without having the understanding of the agreement. Clerk Lovejoy Roe said she did not bring it up but she felt that went both ways because Supervisor Stumbo had not brought it up either. She said she was excited about the three full-time officials meeting weekly because this misunderstanding and any hurt feelings could have been alleviated. Clerk Lovejoy Roe stressed there was never any intention to harm or say that Ms. Keen was not doing a good job because she was doing a great job. She said she just wanted to make a clarification.

Supervisor Stumbo said she thought it was how you look at things and she did not see it as a huge raise for anyone. She said she saw it as someone absorbing a whole position that was eliminated.

Treasurer Doe said you have to look at the whole picture. The job was being paid at close to \$60,000 and even if she was paid, more the Township was still saving a lot of money. He said he felt it was a win, win and he appreciated the job Ms. Keen was doing.

Supervisor Stumbo said there was also the issue about a lump sum and treating everyone equal. She clarified that the lump sum had been at the request of the employee. Supervisor Stumbo stated that she wanted that clarified because sometimes records, like minutes had a tendency to make you look a certain way and she did not want anyone to think that they were trying to mislead, misguide, hide or do anything intentionally. She said she thought it was important that the record was clear on both of the issues and asked that it be included in the minutes.

4. AUTHORIZATION TO POST AND FILL 1-2 BUILDING ATTENDANT POSITIONS AT RECREATION

A motion was made by Clerk Lovejoy Roe, supported by Treasurer Doe to authorize posting and filling of 1-2 Building Attendant positions at Recreation and to offer them to the laid-off employees. The motion carried unanimously.

There was no further discussion.

Jeff Allen, RSD Director said the resolution should read the anticipated cost to the Township would not exceed \$60,000.

RE: Purchase of Retirement Service Credit – Daniel Dzierbicki

All regular Township employees, with the exception of the firefighters, participate in the Michigan Municipal Employees Retirement System (MERS). Our MERS program is a defined benefit retirement program that pays a retirement allowance based on the following formula: (Credited Service Years) x (2.25% multiplier) x (final average compensation).

MERS offers employee members three options for purchasing additional service credit. Employees, with the approval of their governing board can purchase up to five years of military service credit, five years other governmental service credit, and five years of generic service credit.

Daniel Dzierbicki has requested to purchase 1 year, 5 months of Generic service credit. Based on current benefit levels MERS calculated the actuarial cost of purchasing the generic service credit would be \$16,913.00. The actuary from MERS takes into consideration current benefit levels, increased future benefit costs for adding service time, life expectancy, and a conservative rate of return on investment when calculating the cost. The goal of this process is to transfer the projected financial burden for the added service time from the retirement fund to the employee making the purchase.

Understanding that Daniel Dzierbicki would be responsible for the full \$16,913.00 to cover the expected impact on the fund, recommendation is being sought for approval by the Township Board to adopt the attached resolution approving Daniel Dzierbicki the ability to purchase one year, five months of generic service.

RESOLUTION 2011-1

Whereas, in 2007 the Charter Township of Ypsilanti Board approved Resolution 2007-18 adopting a residential rental inspection Ordinance 2007-373, as amended, requiring periodic inspections of all single and duplex rental dwelling units within the Township; and

Whereas, resolution 2007-18 provided that Ordinance 2007-373, as amended, “will, at this time, only be used as a basis to implement a pilot rental code inspection program in the West Willow and Sugarbrook neighborhoods using CDBG funds;” and

Whereas, the Township Board has determined that the rental code inspection program should be expanded Township wide to include all single and duplex rental residential units in Ypsilanti Township, and

Whereas, the Township Board has determined that the period between the issuance of certificates of compliance and renewal certificates should be changed from 30 months to 24 months.

Now therefore, be it resolved, that Ypsilanti township Residential Rental Inspection Ordinance, sections 48-42 and 48-45 shall be amended to require renewal of inspection certificates every 24 months;

Be it further resolved that Ordinance 2011-411 attached hereto which requires renewal of inspection certificates every 24 months is adopted by reference;

Be it further resolved that the Township Office of Community Standards is directed to implement and commence inspections of residential rental units in accordance with Section 48-42 as amended throughout the Township.

**PROPOSED
ORDINANCE NO. 2011-411**

An ordinance amending the One and Two Unit Rental Inspection Ordinance in the Code of Ordinances for the Charter Township of Ypsilanti, Washtenaw County, Michigan

The Charter Township of Ypsilanti hereby ordains that Charter Township Code of Ordinances be amended as follows:

1. Delete section 48-42 entitled Certificate of Compliance required in its entirety and add the following new language in section 48-42:

(a) The Department shall provide for the systematic inspection of all single and duplex dwelling units which are subject to rental agreements in the Township for the purposes of determining whether such units are in compliance with the code and this chapter. Those units that are in compliance shall be issued a Certificate of Compliance.

(b) The Department shall schedule initial inspections, at its discretion, of single and duplex dwelling units which are subject to rental agreements to determine if the units qualify for a Certificate of Compliance. The owner of the property shall receive not less than 30 days' prior notice of the Departments' intent to inspect the property. The owner shall provide to the tenant a minimum of 72 hours written notice of the Township's intent to inspect the property. After the initial phase-in period, all single and duplex rental dwelling units which are subject to rental agreements shall be required to be inspected at not less than 24 month intervals, or at the reasonable discretion of the building official.

(c) No person, either the owner or the owner's agent, shall rent or lease single or duplex dwelling units after the initial inspection, to any tenant, unless that owner or agent has first obtained a valid Certificate of Compliance from the Department covering the unit. For new construction the original Certificate of Occupancy shall serve as the Certificate of Compliance for a period of 24 months.

(d) The Department shall advise the landlord and tenant that either has the right to refuse entry for purposes of inspection unless a search warrant is first obtained. If entry is refused, the Department shall apply to the appropriate judicial officer for a search warrant and shall not inspect until a valid search warrant is obtained. Inspections shall be limited to only the areas necessary to ascertain compliance with the Code.

(e) An owner or owner's agent who is provided, during an inspection of a single or duplex dwelling unit, with written notice of a Code violation or violations, shall correct the code violations within the period specified in the notice of violations.

2. Delete in its entirety section 48-45 entitled Expiration of Certificate of Compliance and add the following new language in section 48-45.

Certificates of compliance shall be valid for 24 months after the date of issuance unless suspended by the Department. The date of issuance and expiration shall be recorded on the Certificate. It is the duty of the owner of the property to arrange for the inspection necessary for the renewal of the Certificate at least 30 days prior to its expiration.

Severability

Should any section, subdivision, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared by the Courts to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof other than the part as invalidate.

Publication

This Ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation as required by law.

Effective date

This Ordinance shall become effective six months after publication in a newspaper of general circulation as required by law.

Amending the fee schedule for Residential Rental Inspections

Whereas, the Charter Township of Ypsilanti in 2007 adopted Residential Rental Unit Inspection Ordinance (2007-373), as amended; and

Whereas, the Residential Rental Inspection Ordinance was implemented in 2007 as a pilot program in the West Willow and Sugarbrook neighborhoods; and

Whereas, the Township Board has adopted Resolution 2011-1 directing the Office of Community Standards to implement Township wide the Residential Rental Inspection Ordinance; and

Whereas, the Township Board has determined that the residential Rental Inspection Fee Schedule adopted by resolution 2007-19 should be revised.
