CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF YPSILANTI MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER 6, 2016 REGULAR BOARD MEETING

Supervisor Stumbo called the meeting to order at approximately 7:02 pm in the Ypsilanti Township Civic Center Board Room, 7200 S. Huron River Drive, Ypsilanti Township. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silent prayer observed.

PUBLIC HEARING

A. 7:00PM – RESOLUTION 2016-65, CREATION OF STREETLIGHT SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT #208 FOR THE TREMONT SUBDIVISION (PUBLIC HEARING SET AT THE NOVEMBER 1, 2016 REGULAR MEETING)

Supervisor Stumbo declared the Public Hearing open at 7:03 pm

Karen Facer, Township Resident stated that she and her husband have not been supportive of the streetlight assessment. She said the petition began about 2 years ago and never had a cap to it. She said there was misinformation two years ago and people believed there would be no tax increase. Ms. Facer stated that due to the misinformation and that she thinks the lights they already have don't help she and her husband are against the streetlights. She said she has lights on her home from dusk to dawn that she feels are sufficient.

Edna Shelby, Township Resident stated that she passed out the petitions and the residents that signed her petitions knew the cost for the streetlights. She stated she was in favor of the streetlights.

Charles Foster, Township Resident stated he had been living in the Tremont subdivision for 11 years and he signed the petition for streetlights. He stated he did not have a light on his street and he has had trouble with vandals and it was very dark. He said he was still in favor of the streetlights but he would like a streetlight next to his house but he did not see one on the current plans.

Supervisor Stumbo stated she was aware that he would like one placed by his home but also stated the bulbs for all the streetlights would be changed to LED which would make the area brighter.

Bryan Cutliff, Township Resident stated he did not receive a map and Clerk Lovejoy Roe gave him a map. He stated he was in favor of the streetlights.

Mr. Pado, Township Resident stated he was in favor of the streetlights.

Dan Beauregard, Township Resident stated he was for the streetlights and questioned who was paying the \$66,000.00. Supervisor Stumbo stated that it would be split between the homeowners minus the grant from the Township.

Supervisor Stumbo stated she lived in Tremont and she always favors whenever 51% of the owners are in favor of it and changing to LED would make the existing lights brighter.

Clerk Lovejoy Roe stated that she received two emails from residents who were not able to attend this hearing but wished their voices to be heard. She said Mr. Peter Horner was not in favor of the streetlights and Mr. Michael Smith was in favor of the streetlights.

Supervisor Stumbo closed the Public Hearing at 7:13 pm.

Trustee Wilson stated that on the map it showed that Mr. Foster does not have a streetlight back in the area of his home and asked if one could be placed there. Clerk Lovejoy Roe stated that one might be able to be placed there but we could not add an extra streetlight that is not on the map. She said that Colchester had one extra light and she said it could be moved to Regent Drive near Mr. Foster. Supervisor Stumbo said if residents were expecting a streetlight near their home she didn't feel comfortable moving one to another street. She stated that when she moved into her home she thought the plan showed streetlights on her street and when they were installed there were no streetlights on her street. She said she did agree that Regent needs a streetlight. Supervisor Stumbo stated that the Resolution would be brought to the next board meeting and the board would take in to consideration the placing of the streetlights in the Resolution.

Trustee Jarrell Roe asked Supervisor Stumbo to explain the grant which was discussed in the work session. Supervisor Stumbo stated DTE had provided the township with grants for converting streetlights to LED which are brighter and more economical, therefore, the grants reduced the cost of the conversions to LED and the Township paid for the match on the grants and not the residents.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Arloa Kaiser, Township Resident voiced concern over changing our State Flag. She said it would be a waste of money to do it and she would like the Township to go on record that they oppose changing the flag. She encouraged residents to call the state legislature and oppose changing the flag.

JoAnn McCullum, Township Resident stated that she appreciates the board looking out for our environment regarding the Nexus pipeline.

2. REQUEST AUTHORIZATION FOR TOWNSHIP ATTORNEY DOUG WINTERS TO ENTER INTO NEGOTIATIONS WITH NEXUS FOR TEMPORARY AND PERMANENT EASEMENT AGREEMENTS

A motion was made by Clerk Lovejoy Roe, supported by Treasurer Doe to Approve Request Authorization for Township Attorney Doug Winters to Enter into Negotiations with Nexus for Temporary and Permanent Easement Agreements.

Trustee Ross-Williams asked Paul Boyce, Right of Way Supervisor for Nexus in Michigan, if the Township did not negotiate temporary and permanent easement agreements would Nexus still proceed on Township property next to Ford Lake. Mr. Boyce stated that if negotiations failed with the issuance of FERC, Federal Energy Regulatory Commission yes that would give Nexus the right to secure the unsecured easements. Supervisor Stumbo stated the Township adopted a Resolution opposing the pipeline but asked Mr. Boyce if Nexus was asking for a variance to eliminate the odor that gives warning when the pipeline was leaking. Mr. Boyce stated he was not aware of eliminating a warning. Supervisor Stumbo stated that she would need to know the answer. She asked Mr. Boyce how many easements have been received from township residents and he said they were about 65% secured. Mr. Boyce stated they were having great success in Washtenaw County and Ypsilanti Township. Supervisor Stumbo asked if they've received federal approval and he said they haven't at this time but they had received final approval on their environmental impact statement which was an indication that FERC was looking favorably at their project. Supervisor Stumbo questioned Mr. Boyce about the easement they are asking for on the shoreline and he said it was a temporary easement used as a work space for the project. Treasurer Doe said he thought the easement of the NE side of the lake was for environmental studies. Mr. Boyce explained that the NE side of lake that Treasurer Doe was asking about was only for survey work not easements. Mr. Boyce stated they are not doing the environmental studies that Treasurer Doe asked about. Trustee Jarrell Roe asked Mr. Boyce about any environmental issues with the pipeline. Mr. Boyce stated he doesn't believe that there would be any environmental impacts regarding the pipeline. He said it was a natural gas pipeline buried at a minimum of three feet deep and in some cases as deep as ten feet deep. Clerk Lovejoy Roe would like to have Attorney Winters to negotiate to make certain the odor detection equipment would be used in the pipeline throughout Ypsilanti Township. Supervisor Stumbo suggested the board table this request until they receive confirmation on the questions.

Trustee Eldridge and Clerk Lovejoy Roe agreed that a room with windows would be a better choice. Clerk Lovejoy Roe asked about insurance for having a workout room. Angela Verges stated she would look for other rooms.

Whereas, the Charter Township of Ypsilanti ("Township") Zoning Code

currently contains a definition of the term "family" which the Township's Planning

Commission has recommended be replaced with a definition of the term which

clarifies the precise meaning of the term as it is used within the Township's Zoning

Code; and

Whereas, the Township's Zoning Code does not contain a definition of the

term "rooming house" and the Township Planning Commission has recommended

that a definition of the term be included in the definitions section of the Township

Zoning Code to clarify what is meant when the term is used within the Zoning Code;

and

Whereas, Township Ordinance 2016-471, repeals the current definition of

the term "family" that appears in the Township Zoning Code, and replaces it with

a new, updated definition of the word "family" recommended by the Township

Planning Commission; and

Whereas, Township Ordinance 2016-471, defines the term "rooming house"

as used within the Zoning Code;

Now therefore, be it resolved that Ordinance 2016-471, is hereby adopted

by reference.

ORDINANCE 2016-471

An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 74, the Township Zoning Code, Regarding Definitions

The Charter Township of Ypsilanti hereby ordains that
Ordinance No. 74, the Ypsilanti Township Zoning Code, adopted May
18, 1994, shall be amended as follows:

- Delete in its entirety the definition of "family" set forth in section 201 of the Township Zoning Code.
- II. Add the following new definition:

Family:

- 1. A single individual or a number of individuals domiciled together whose relationship is of a continuing nontransient, domestic character and who are cooking and living together as a single, nonprofit housekeeping unit, related by the bonds of consanguinity, marriage, or adoption, together with servants of the principal occupants and not more than one (1) additional unrelated person, with all of such individuals being domiciled together as a single, domestic, housekeeping unit in a dwelling.
- 2. The functional equivalent of the domestic family, that is, persons living together in a dwelling unit whose relationship is of a permanent and distinct character and is the functional equivalent of a domestic family, with a demonstrable and recognizable bond which constitutes the functional equivalent of the bonds which render the domestic family a cohesive unit. This definition shall not include any rooming house, society, club, fraternity, sorority, association, lodge, coterie organization or group whose association is temporary or seasonal in character or nature. For the purposes of enforcement, it is presumed that a functional equivalent of a domestic family is limited to six (6) or fewer persons.
- III. Add the following new definition to section 201 of the Zoning Code:
 Rooming House:
 - A residential building where rooms or suites of rooms are rented, for compensation whether under a written lease or not, by arrangement for definite periods, where the renters use common facilities, such as hallways and bathrooms. A rooming house

shall not include hotels, motels, apartment houses, tourist homes, one-family dwellings, two and multi-family dwellings or fraternity and sorority houses.

Severability

In the event that any one or more sections, provisions, phrases or words of this ordinance shall be found to be invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect the validity nor the enforceability of the remaining sections, provisions, phrases or words of this Ordinance unless expressly so determined by a Court of competent jurisdiction.

Non Exclusivity

The prohibitions and penalties provided for in this Ordinance shall be in addition to, and not exclusive of, other prohibitions and penalties provided for by other law, ordinance, or rule/regulation.

Publication

This Ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation as required by law.

Effective date

This Ordinance shall become effective upon publication in a newspaper of general circulation as required by law.

Resolution 2016-60

RESOLUTION TO ADOPT THE ANNUAL EXEMPTION OPTION AS SET FORTH IN 2011 PUBLIC ACT 152, THE PUBLICLY FUNDED HEALTH INSURANCE CONTRIBUTION ACT

WHEREAS, 2011 Public Act 152 (the "Act") was passed by the State Legislature and signed by the Governor on September 24, 2011;

WHEREAS, the Act contains three options for complying with the requirements of the Act;

WHEREAS, the three options are as follows:

- 1) Section 3 "Hard Caps" Option limits a public employer's total annual health care costs for employees based on coverage levels, as defined in the Act;
- 2) Section 4 "80%/20%" Option limits a public employer's share of total annual health care costs to not more than 80%. This option requires an annual majority vote of the governing body;
- 3) Section 8 "Exemption" Option a local unit of government, as defined in the Act, may exempt itself from the requirements of the Act by an annual 2/3 vote of the governing body;

WHEREAS, the Charter Township of Ypsilanti Board of Trustees has decided to adopt the annual Exemption option as its choice of compliance under the Act:
