Attorney McLain explained the request to the Board. He said the documents were in proper form. Attorney McLain stated this was a very good project if the Board approved it.

Steven Deroshia, ACD.net, stated this would fill the gaps for receiving wireless communication. He said they would be attached to existing structures but some may need to be upgraded.

Trustee Jarrell Roe questioned whether there would be a bond in case any structure would need to come down. Attorney McLain said that if the Township decided on a bond it would come through their office. Supervisor Stumbo asked Mr. Deroshia if DTE or ATT required them to have a bond. Eli Gregg, ACD, stated the companies they have been dealing with do require a joint use agreement which includes provisions for removal if the facilities become abandon and the general rules of the Metro Act included it. Supervisor Stumbo stated she would like to get copies of those agreements. Mr. Gregg said he would look into it.

Attorney McLain stated that in May Judge Kuhnke denied the injunction to prohibit the medical marijuana caregiver operation and granted the operation the right to continue. He said this presents a significant issue, especially in smaller neighborhoods, to have this disruption in the Township due to odor and traffic. He said the Township Ordinance that was adopted in May, 2010 prohibits that type of activity in a residential area. He said the township does allow it in light industrial districts. Attorney McLain stated Judge Kuhnkes' ruling was in direct conflict of the Zoning Enabling Act that allows Municipalities, such as the Township of Ypsilanti, to adopt zonings for the public health, safety and welfare. He said not only does this affect Ypsilanti Township but it also affects everyone across the State. Attorney McLain, with approval from the board, will file the appeal.

Michael Radzik, Director of Office of Community Standards explained the request to the board. He said during budget discussions, the board directed us to increase our police staffing by two Police Service Units. Mr. Radzik stated he asked the Sheriffs' department about adding the Police Service Units and they informed him that the County Board of Commissioners must act first to approve adding/creating two new control numbers for those two new county employees before they would send a contract amendment to add staffing back to the Township. He said the County Board of Commissioners stated the earliest they could decide on this would be sometime in February, 2018. Mr. Radzik stated the Sheriffs' Department said they would do whatever they could to start hiring and begin the training process for the new employees. He said the one-year amendment was at the current staffing of 35 PSUs and the increase would come back to the board at a later date.

Mr. Radzik stated that with talking with Javonna Neel, Accounting Director, they felt after looking at the budget we could hire three Police Service Units and not go under the recommended fund balance. He said he would like the board to consider adding three deputies. He said he was told if we added three PSUs we would also have an additional Sergeant at no extra cost.

Lieutenant Marocco said the Township could use the extra patrols. He said these officers would be on the road and not behind the desk. He said even with adding three new positions we would still have six less officers then we had ten years ago.

Accordingly, I hereby amend the Service Contract between Washtenaw County and Ypsilanti Charter Township dated January 1, 2012 as follows:

Amend ARTICLE II - COMPENSATION AND OVERTIME to extend the contract as follows:

"The price for a PSU is fixed as follows: (1) \$150,594.00 per PSU for 2012; (2) \$152,100.00 per PSU for 2013; (3) \$153,621.00 per PSU for 2014; (4) \$155,157.00 per PSU for 2015; (5) \$156,709.00 per PSU for 2016; (6) \$158,276.00 per PSU for 2017; and (7) \$160,650 per PSU for 2018. Beginning in 2014, the County reserves the right to adjust these prices as a result of significant unforeseen cost increases in line items contained the Direct Cost categories (Salary, Fringe, Uniform Allowance, Gun Allowance and Fleet). The county and Sheriff shall give each Contracting Partner six (6) months written notice of any such increase."

Amend ARTICLE V – TERM to extend the contract as follows:

"The term of this contract shall be for seventy-two months with an effective date of January 1, 2012 and ending on December 31, 2018."
