VII. Reports

A. Staff Reports

Mike Hoffmeister: 1) Ford Lake Park boat docks project will be completed by end of the week. 2) Loonfeather Park update: the Township approved new bid and the FINAL Bond and Insurance documents. The Park is closed and ground-breaking will begin soon although construction may not start till Dec 1. 3) Replaced roof at Community Center to fix significant leaks. 4) The skate park will be closed for repairs Aug 5 & 6. 5) Board of Trustees tree fund discussion: MH has to request that funds are transferred each year and \$5K - \$7K gets 20 to 30 trees each year. David Streeter asked about taking recommendations from community for placement of trees; Starr Smith asked about types of trees planted (MH: disease resistant hard wood like red maple and white oak.) 6) FEMA is set up in the parking lot to assist with in-person floods assistance till 9/15. Will shut down early if no people show up. Hours are from 7 am – 7 pm 7 days/week. 7) Food Truck Fridays update: scheduled for Aug. 13 and 27, and Sept. 3 and 17 (two each at Heritage and Ford Lake.) 8) Art Serafinski Sports Scholarship – Green Oaks Golf outing August 28th to raise funds. 9) MH offered parks tours for commissioners.

Angela Verges: Community Center will hold an Open House on Aug. 4 from 11 am - 1 pm and people can try programs. Arts in the Parks program in partnership with Saline and Pittsfield: North Bay session earlier today had 15 children attend.

Robin Castle-Hine: Rosie the Riveter was successful with 63 crafters, but only 1 food truck. There were 600-800 visitors and the event made over \$2000. Considering holding a craft show in rec center in the future.

B. Commissioner Reports

Commissioner Hodge discussed Sugar Brook Park project: requested \$2500 but received \$4500. Plan to add park benches; weed control fabric has been added and plants coming this week.

David Streeter: Apple Ridge trash issue due to a recent Friday-Saturday celebration. The Parks Dept has limited weekend help and the park was cleaned by Monday.

T.C. Collins Discussed the mission and goals for Willow Run Acres. Deata McLemore from Bottles & Backpacks discussed the educational aspects that T.C. Collins has brought to the students. Tim Wilson from Washtenaw Promise discussed the positive impacts from previous community gardens installed by T.C. Mr. Collins broke down the strategy to a Multi-year rollout of 3 phases described as follows: Phase 1 (years 1 & 2) Establish plots for individuals to farm, explore fencing options to prevent deer or other pests, Solicit input via community outreach and education opportunities. Phase 2 (years 3 & 4) Improvements and grow community participation, begin mapping out potential for a hoop house, explore potential for an on-site well. Phase 3 (year 5 and beyond) Build a hoop house to grow and cultivate own seedlings, Begin a long term and sustainable site model. Discussion and Q&A:

Commissioner Kirby inquired about number and sizes of plots. A: 70 raised beds and 30 separate 20'x20' tilled plots. Commissioner Hodge inquired about compost: A: Plan is to work with the existing Township recycle center across Clark Rd. Commissioner O'Connor inquired about funding A: majority self-funded with Washtenaw Promise to cover potential well drilling and installation. Commissioner Hodge inquired about bee boxes A: Not safe at the moment, will explore in the future.
